Dr. Linda Burnes Bolton (Keynote)

Dr. Linda Burnes Bolton is a renowned leader who oversees the delivery of high-quality nursing care for patients and the development and support of the professional practice of nursing at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center. Additionally, Dr. Bolton oversees the ambulatory care clinics, the Medical Network, and the Marina



Del Rey Hospital, a community hospital affiliate of Cedars-Sinai. She is also a co-investigator of the Regional Collaborative Alliance for Nursing Outcomes research team.

Dr. Peter Buerhaus (Keynote)

Dr. Peter Buerhaus is an internationally renowned nurse economist. He is a professor in the College of Nursing and Director of the Center for Interdisciplinary Health Workforce Studies at Montana State University. Buerhaus' research includes forecasting nurse and physician supply, developing and testing measures of the quality of care in hospitals,



determining public and provider opinions on issues involving the delivery of healthcare, and assessing the quantity and quality of health care provided by nurse practitioners.

Dr. Ernest Grant (Keynote)

Currently vice president of the American Nurses Association (ANA), Ernest J. Grant, PhD, RN, FAAN, has more than 30 years of nursing and leadership experience. In June, Grant was elected to serve as president of ANA at the ANA Membership Assembly. Effective January, 2019, Grant will be the first man to serve as ANA President. Gran is an internationally



recognized burn-care and fire-safety expert. He currently serves as the burn outreach coordinator for the North Carolina Jayce Burn Center at University of North Carolina (UNC) Hospitals in Chapel Hill. In 2002, President George W. Bush presented Grant with a Nurse of the Year Award for his work treating burn victims from the World Trade Center site.
