WHEREAS, there are over 234,000 licensed ARNPs in the United States, and over 7,500 in Washington State, providing primary, acute, and specialty care to patients of all ages and walks of life; and

WHEREAS, NPs diagnose, treat, and prescribe medications and other treatments to patients through a caring, patient-centered, holistic model of care; and

WHEREAS, residents of our state and nation have great trust in the high-quality care NPs provide, resulting in over a billion patient visits annually across the country; and

WHEREAS, five decades of research demonstrates the high quality of care provided by NPs, and better utilization of NPs through modernized state laws and improved system policies supports better health through a more accessible, efficient, cost-effective health care system;

NOW, *THEREFORE*, I, Jay Inslee, Governor of the state of Washington, do hereby proclaim November 11-17, 2018, as

in Washington, and I encourage all people in our state to join me in recognizing the countless contributions that nurse practitioners have made over the past half century, and that they will continue to make, to the health and well-being of the people in our state.
