



# National Health Service Corps Substance Use Disorder Workforce Loan Repayment Program



<b>Program Description</b>	<p>The National Health Service Corps (NHSC) Substance Use Disorder Workforce Loan Repayment Program (SUD Workforce LRP) expands access to evidence-based substance use disorder treatment in underserved, high-need communities across the country. The program offers health care clinicians the opportunity to have their qualifying student loans repaid in exchange for serving at an NHSC-approved SUD site.</p>

<b>Service Commitments</b>	<p><b>Full-Time Option:</b> 3 years of full-time service (minimum 40 hours/week, 45 weeks/year).</p> <p><b>Half-Time Option:</b> 3 years of half-time service (minimum 20 hours/week, 45 weeks/year)*.</p>

<b>Application Requirements and Priority Information</b>	<p>Applicants must be a U.S. citizen (U.S. born or naturalized) or U.S. national</p> <p><b>Clinicians receive priority if they:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Have a DATA 2000 waiver to provide medication-assisted treatment;</li> <li>• Serve in an opioid treatment program; <i>or</i></li> <li>• Are licensed or certified in substance use disorder interventions, such as master's-level substance use disorder counselors.</li> </ul>

<b>Where Members Serve</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>NHSC SUD Workforce LRP applicants must work at an NHSC-approved SUD site located in a Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA).</li> <li>An NHSC-approved SUD site must meet the requirements in the <a href="#">NHSC Site Agreement</a> and <a href="#">NHSC Site Reference Guide</a>.</li> <li><b>Eligible sites can include:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>SAMHSA-certified outpatient treatment programs (OTPs)</li> <li>Office-based opioid treatment facilities (OBOTs)</li> <li>Non-opioid substance use disorder treatment facilities (SUD treatment facilities)</li> <li>Federally Qualified Health Care Centers (FQHCs)</li> <li>Rural Health Clinics (RHCs)</li> <li>American Indian Health facilities and Indian Health Service (IHS) hospitals</li> <li>FQHC Look-Alikes</li> <li>State or federal correctional facilities</li> <li>Critical Access Hospitals</li> <li>Community health centers</li> <li>State or local health departments</li> <li>Community outpatient facilities</li> <li>Private practices</li> <li>School-based clinics</li> <li>Mobile units and free clinics</li> </ul> </li> <li><b>Clinicians qualify for the NHSC SUD Workforce LRP:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>If they work at a SUD site with a HPSA score that would ordinarily be too low to qualify for NHSC funding.</li> <li>Using either the mental health or primary care HPSA score of their NHSC-approved SUD site.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
