
Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner (PMHNP) Fellowship Program



Behavioral Health Services at The Queen's Medical Center is excited to announce we are accepting applications for our new Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner (PMHNP) Fellowship Program.

The PMHNP Fellowship opportunity is a 12-month experience focused on psychiatric care including both direct patient care and didactic lectures. The fellowship program is designed for new to practice APRN's (new graduate up to 24-months of experience). Fellows will gain firsthand experience working with Hawaii's serious mental illness (SMI) population through outpatient and inpatient services, Psychiatric Consultation Liaison services, Emergency Services, and more. Goals include increased knowledge related to neuroanatomy, pharmacology, therapeutic modalities, and general psychiatric care.

Eligibility:

- Minimum of a clinical master's degree in nursing from an accredited nursing program by December 2020
- Unencumbered licensure as an APRN by the Hawaii Board of Nursing by April 2020
- Certification from a nationally recognized credentialing body (ANCC) in the following area: Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner (PMHNP) by March 2020
- < 24 months of clinical experience as a PMHNP

Program Dates: July 2020-June 2021

Location: Honolulu, HI (various clinic sites, and both the Punchbowl and West hospital campus')

Application Deadline: February 21, 2020 (2-step process of emailed application and an online application with HR is required if chosen to proceed with an interview)

In-person vs. Video Interviews: February-March, 2020. All applicants are notified of final outcome by March 31, 2020.

Pay/Benefits: \$90,000 salary for 12-months, includes health and dental insurance, vacation/holiday/sick pay.
