1980











1986 APRNs













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- APNs gained limited prescriptive authority at sites serving medically underserved populations.
- Required weekly onsite MD visits
- Medicaid reimbursement was 65-70% of MD










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








1995 APRNs







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1997

- Onsite MD visits requirements decreased from weekly to Q 10 days
- Insurance companies were required to reimburse APRNs
- Managed Care company required to include APRN on panel if collaborating MD on panel.










- Eliminates the sitebased requirements and replaces with a standardized prescriptive authority agreement.
- Allowed prescribing Schedule II in hospital and hospice




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

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








Growth of APRNs













2019 APRNs by Specialty





All licensed APRNs by Specialty












All Licensed APRNs by Specialty





Texas Medical Provider 10yr Growth Rate





Total Texas PSYCH-APRNs












Texas Psych-APRNs Newly Licensed Each Yr

The Preceptor Problem

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Limitations

- Are licensed in Texas but may not practice in Texas
- May not be in active practice.
- May be dually licensed and not practice all roles
- Not all APRN providers of psychiatric care are certified as PMHNP or PMHCNS.









Conclusions

- In 40 years (1980-2020) APRN become a significant provider of medical care. Approximately 1/3 of medical providers are APRNs.
- There are 3 X as many APRNs as PAs.
- Psych-APRN are 40% of psychiatric providers in Texas.
- In 12 yrs the number of Psych-APRN has grown 4 X more than psychiatrist (40% vs 162% increase).
- Psych-APRNs have increased almost 10 X the rate of Tx population growth. (17% vs 162%).
- In 2019, newly licensed Psych-APRN were 11% of the total of all psychiatric providers in Texas.
