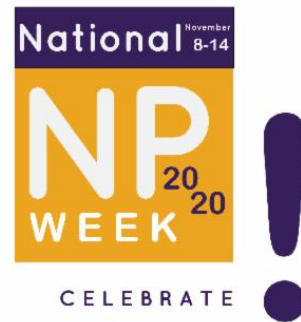

Each year, Nurse Practitioner (NP) Week is celebrated the second week of November to honor NPs for their vital contributions to health care in the United States.

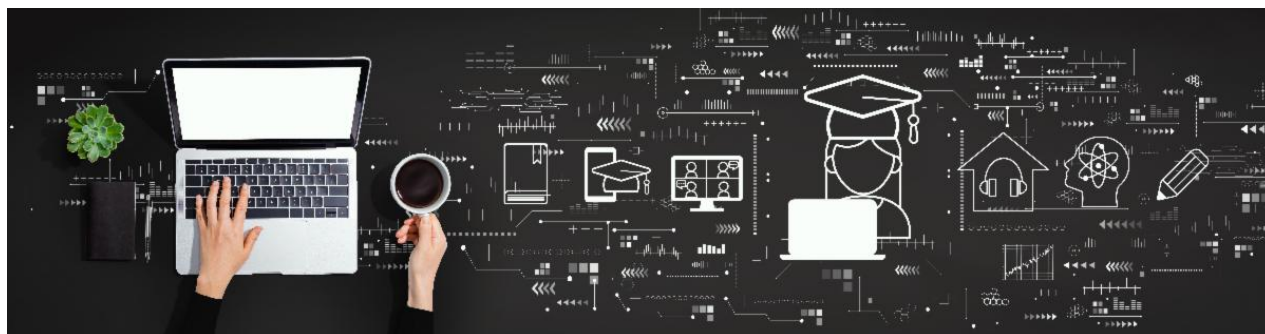
