Research Priorities: Charting a Path to Achieve Health Equity: Eliminating restrictions on the scope of practice of advanced practice registered nurses and registered nurses so they can practice to the full extent of their education and training will increase the types and number of high-quality health care services that can be provided to those with complex health and social needs and will improve access to both healthcare and health equity.

A lack of consensus continues to exist among state boards, legislators, third-party payers, hospital administrators, health care workers, and even NPs themselves on what "autonomy" means (AANP, 2018a; Weiland, 2008). This incongruency displays the need for the development of a clear definition of NP autonomy and clear steps for the acquisition, recognition, and utilization of NP autonomy nationally.

### A concept analysis of nurse practitioner autonomy:



Nurse practitioners (NPs) have struggled to describe their role in health care, and state regulations vary in an NP's ability to prescribe medications; diagnose, order, and interpret diagnostic tests; obtain independent reimbursement; and be allowed hospital privileges (American Association of Nurse Practitioners [AANP], 2018b).

Nurses have substantial and often untapped expertise to help individuals and communities' access to high-quality health care, particularly in providing care for people in underserved rural and urban areas. Improved telehealth technology and payment systems have the potential to increase access, allowing patients to obtain care in their homes and neighborhoods. However, the ability of nurses to practice fully in these and other settings is limited by state and federal laws that prohibit them from working to the full extent of their education and training.

### Covid19 vaccine:



COVID-19 vaccines are by no means a silver bullet. With more COVID-19 vaccines expecting approval in the coming months, it is necessary to note that vaccine availability does not equate to vaccine accessibility, nor vaccine efficacy. Some research suggests that approximately 9 out of 10 individuals living in lower-income countries will not have access to COVID-19 vaccines until 2023 or later. For higher-income countries, such as the United States, the prevalence of vaccine hesitancy may further compound the situation. These insights combined, in turn, emphasize the fact that even though COVID-19 vaccines are becoming more available, safety measures (e.g., face masks, personal hygiene, and social distancing) are still of pivotal importance in protecting personal and public health against COVID-19. Furthermore, this paper argues for the continued imperative for health experts and government officials to communicate and emphasize the importance of COVID-19 safety measures with the public, to make sure people are protected against COVID-19 till the pandemic ceases to pose a threat to personal or public health.

## Legislation:

The implementation of the Affordable Care Act (2010) enabled more than 30 million people to have new access to primary care services. On the basis of current utilization patterns, demand for primary care providers is expected to grow more rapidly than physician supply. This imbalance is expected to worsen, as the aging population requires more health care resources. In addition, more patients are requiring critical care services and physician numbers are not keeping with this growing need. Restrictions on resident physician practice hours have impacted inpatient care as well.

Revisiting outdated state practice laws and considering Full Practice Authority (FPA) for nurse practitioners (NP), is needed for improving access to care while creating greater flexibility for development of patient-centered health care homes and other emerging models of care delivery.
