

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PAC Updates



NBNPA supports legislation that would lift barriers that prevent Nurse Practitioners (NP) from practicing to the full scope of their education and licensure. There are several organizations and institutions who are adept in understanding that advance practice registered nurses (APRN's) contributions to medical care improve timely delivery of healthcare, thus increasing access to our most vulnerable populations. Currently, NP's practice independently in 26 states and in Washington DC.

NBNPA supports TNP efforts for SB 1700!

The "HEAL" Bill SB 1700 (Healthcare Expanded and Accessed Locally for Texans), is stalling in the Senate of the 88th Legislature. This is a bi-partisan bill that supports increase to healthcare access by all Texans.

Texas 2023 Healthcare Rankings:

Texas is ranked 50th among all states in access to high quality prenatal and maternal care! Texas ranked last in providing access to mental health services and treatment! (98% of Texas is designated by the federal government as mental health professional shortage areas). Texas is ranked 50th overall due to lack of access to medical care, insurance and annual preventative services!
