Typical presentation: 5 A's of Alzheimer's disease (AD)

- 1. Amnesia Difficulties with memory particularly short–term memory
- 2. Aphasia Both receptive aphasia and expressive aphasia becomes diminished.
- 3. Agnosia Inability to recognize objects/people that were previously well known
- 4. Apraxia Inability to perform motor skills and sequence actions
- 5. Associated Symptoms Hallucinations, delusions disturbed behavior or mood

Clinical course: AD is progressive but the rate can vary. The average life expectancy after diagnosis is 8-10 years.

Diagnosis: Criteria for diagnosis has been established by the National Institute on Aging and the Alzheimer's Association (NIA-AA) in these guidelines, the workgroups identified Alzheimer's disease as a continuum with three distinct Stages: Preclinical, Mild Cognitive Impairment and Dementia.

Treatment: Referrals, Nonpharmacologic therapy, Medications (Cholinesterase Inhibitors, Memantine, Aducanumab, And Vitamin E)

Ending the HIV Epidemic in the U.S. Initiative emphasize diagnosing individuals as soon as possible and ensuring the availability of multiple HIV testing modalities to best meet the needs of populations with increased risk of transmission due to a wide range of social, economic, and demographic factors (such as stigma, discrimination, etc.).

Organizations, including the CDC, will be distributing free HIV testing kits.
