

ADVOCACY



SB 911: HEAL Texans Act

On February 5, Senator Blanco will hold a press conference to introduce SB 911, the HEAL Texans Act, which seeks to remove the requirement for nurse practitioners (NPs) and clinical nurse specialists (CNSs) to have a delegating physician. The proposed legislation includes a requirement for a specified number of supervised practice hours and currently does not authorize the prescribing of Schedule II medications; however, further details are still under discussion.

Additional bills affecting the nursing profession have been filed, with more expected in the legislative pipeline. Nurses can stay informed about relevant legislation by visiting the Nursing Legislative Action Coalition (NLAC), Texas Nurses Association (TNA), and Texas Nurse Practitioners (TNP) websites. We encourage all nurses to engage with their state senators and representatives to advocate for policies that support the profession and enhance patient care. - Stella Logan, Legislative Chair
