NPARI Academic Scholarship 2025

NPARI is offering scholarships of up to \$1,000 for Nurse Practitioner students enrolled in accredited graduate programs.

• Deadline: November 1, 2025 (by 5 PM)

• Recipient Notified: November 7, 2025

• Awarded: November 12, 2025 at the Annual Meeting

Eligibility: Must be an NPARI member, a licensed RN, and enrolled in a Master's or Doctoral NP program.

To Apply: Submit the application, attestation form, and a short essay (250 words or less) by email to <u>carley@uri.edu</u> with "NPARI Scholarship" in the memo.

This scholarship is funded by the Nurse Practitioner Alliance of RI (NPARI) and is awarded subject to available funding. Applicants for 2025 scholarships must be NPARI members currently enrolled in an accredited Nurse Practitioner (NP) graduate program leading to an advanced degree or certification. Applicants must be licensed as a registered nurse. Only completed applications will be accepted and reviewed.

- Amount of Award: Students may receive up to \$1,000 in scholarships. Application Deadline: November 1, 2025. All documents must be posted by 5pm.
- Notification Procedure: The scholarship recipient will be notified by November 7, 2025 and the award will be made at the annual meeting on November 12, 2025.
- Application Procedure: Must be an NP (master's or doctoral) student and member in good standing of NPARI. Please include the following:
 - a. Completion of the application and attestation form (on NPARI website). An NP program faculty member must complete the attestation section of the form.
 - b.A short essay to include plan for the future of NP practice answering: How do you see your education transforming your nursing practice from basic to advanced practice nursing at the individual and professional level? (250 words or less)
 - c.The application, attestation forms and essay must be emailed to <u>carley@uri.edu</u> In the memo section of the email but NPARI Scholarship.

Legislative Update

Rhode Island:

- Government Affairs Committee meeting pending; will follow up on house bill: H5256, which didn't make it past committee to establish parity for NP's in private practice to receive the same reimbursement as physicians.

Federal:

- The 2025 AANP Region 1&2 member meeting for RI, CT, ME, MA, NH, NJ, NY, Puerto Rico and VT, will be held on October 25th from 8am - 10:30am via Zoom. Registration is free for all AANP members.
- The US district court for central district of California issued a ruling (in Palmer vs Bonta, doctor title lawsuit), that upheld the limitations on nurse practitioners with doctorate degrees, using the title 'doctor'. AANP responded with a filed amicus brief (which can be found on the website). AANP fully supports the ability of NPs to use their earned academic credentials and will continue to do so.
- The legislation authorized an extension of many of the Medicare telehealth flexibilities that were in place during the COVID-19 public health emergency through Sept. 30, 2025. Without congressional action, these flexibilities were not extended beyond the Sept. 30, 2025, date.
 - In the absence of congressional action, the agency recommends practitioners who choose to perform telehealth services that are not payable by Medicare on or after Oct. 1, 2025, may want to evaluate providing beneficiaries with an Advance Beneficiary Notice of Non-coverage.
- If any member is experiencing issues with an agency due to the government shutdown, please reach out to AANP federal government affairs staff by emailing governmentaffairs@aanp.org. AANP will monitor agencies for the latest guidance and stand by to assist members with any questions.
