2026 AANP HEALTH POLICY CONFERENCE

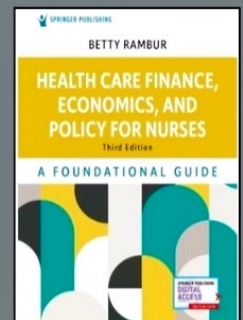
**Registration is still open for the National Health Policy conference:

Rhode Island brings a very special speaker to the conference session: Unleashing the Full Power of Nurse Practitioners: Navigating Payment Policy, Cost Containment, and Innovation in the US Health Care System—Now is Our Time! led by **Dr. Betty Rambur**. The presentation details the powerful moment NPs are in to shape health care financing, payment, and value—rather than simply reacting to it. The session will unpack why national health expenditures continue to grow, why traditional market forces have failed to improve outcomes or lower costs, and how waste, low-value care, and misaligned incentives drive both patient hardship and practitioner frustration. It will also highlight what is changing in Medicare payment models, rural health investments, prescription drug policy, and value-based initiatives, and why these shifts matter profoundly for nurse practitioners' daily practice and longterm influence.

Most importantly, the session is designed as a practical call to action. Concrete strategies will be shared for nurse practitioners to lead in value-based care, make their contributions visible in terms of outcomes and cost stewardship, and "invite themselves to the table" in policy and payment conversations where their voices are urgently needed. From chronic care and telehealth to institutional special needs plans and rural health transformation, nurse practitioners are uniquely positioned to translate value for patients, payers, and communities. This window of opportunity is too important to sit out.

GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS COMMITTEE UPDATE

As we patiently wait for the legislative session to move forward, the committee met on January 6, to plan our agenda for the year. To date, here are the bills of interest to NPs:

1. H-7171 that would prohibit any provider from securing payment in any form from patients before they are seen.
 2. H-7029 that would limit RNs from doing home based foot care without extra training. Plus they would need to be supervised by a provider (MD or NP) to perform the care.
- Most importantly the Dept of Health has issued regulations that would limit NPs from administering certain sedating medications without direct supervision. There will be public hearings on this and we will let you know.
 - The Care Transformation Committee is determining whether the provider preceptor reimbursement budget item will be extended to a second year. We will keep you informed!
 - Lastly, we have been toying with 2 ideas:
 - To float a payment reform bill that would equalize 3rd party payments among physicians, NPs and PAs
 - A bill that would garner state funds to establish nurse practitioner residences.
