

Keynote & Pre-Conference Presenter, Dr. Angela Golden



Angela K. Golden, DNP, FNP-C, FAANP

The Program Planning Committee is delighted to welcome Dr. Angela Golden back to Vermont for the VNPA's 24th Annual Conference. Dr has served Arizona NPs for many years in numerous elected positions. Current president of the American Association of Nurse Practitioners, she has served as Vice President, Secretary, and Legislative Chair of the Arizona NP Council as well as Conference Chairperson. For six years, she was the Arizona state representative for the American Academy of Nurse Practitioners.

Dr. Golden has 35 years of nursing experience. Having received her BSN in 1977 from Ball State University, she went on to obtain her masters in nursing education in 1996 from the University of Phoenix, then completed her MSN with a family nurse practitioner certification in 1998 from Northern Arizona University. In December 2008, she completed her Doctor of Nursing Practice at Arizona State University

with an emphasis on health policy and evidence based practice.

Dr. Golden is an Assistant Professor at Northern Arizona University teaching in their undergraduate and graduate programs. She owns her own family primary care practice, NP from Home, LLC. Dr. Golden regularly presents at the local, state and national level and has published in journals and texts, having edited the Flight Nursing Review Manual. She presently provides primary care in Northern Arizona and in an urgent care in the Phoenix metropolitan area. Dr. Golden was honored to be the recipient of the 2009 American Academy of Nurse Practitioners Arizona Nurse Practitioner Excellence Award.

On Thursday evening Dr. Golden will lead a discussion on current healthcare trends affecting NPs and the role that NPs must play in creating change in the future healthcare environment. Friday, Dr. Golden will present our keynote address with a look at the health policy landscape, where the past has led our profession and what we will need to do as we travel further along the "trail".


