Margaret Flinter is Senior Vice President and Clinical Director of the Community Health Center, Inc. and is a family nurse practitioner by profession. Margaret earned her Bachelor's Degree in Nursing from the University of Connecticut, her Master's Degree from Yale University, and her doctoral degree at the University of Connecticut. She was the recipient of a Robert Wood Johnson Executive Nurse Fellowship from 2002-2005.

Following her graduate training at Yale University, Margaret joined the Community Health Center in 1980 as a National Health Service Corps Scholar and CHC's first nurse practitioner. Since 1987 she has held both clinical and administrative leadership roles in the organization. She recently established the Weitzman Center for Innovation in Community Health and Primary Care as the "research and development" arm of CHC and serves as the Director of the Weitzman Center. Margaret is also the founder of America's first Nurse practitioner residency program which operates out of the Community Health Center.


Harry L. Chen, MD was appointed Commissioner of the Vermont Department of Health in January 2011. Dr. Chen was appointed Acting Secretary of the Vermont Agency of Human Services by Governor Peter Shumlin, serving from August 2014 - January 2015.

Prior to his appointment as commissioner, Dr. Chen worked as an emergency physician at Rutland Regional Medical Center for over 20 years, and served as Medical Director from 1998-2004. He is on the clinical faculty at the University of Vermont College of Medicine and served as vice chair of the University of Vermont Board of Trustees.

Dr. Chen earned his medical degree and completed his residency in emergency medicine at the Oregon Health Sciences University School of Medicine, serving as chief resident. He worked at and was on the faculty of the

George Washington University Medical Center, Department of Emergency Medicine from 1983-1988. From 2004-2008, Dr. Chen was a member of the Vermont House of Representatives, and was vice chair of the Health Care Committee during his final term.

In 2008, Dr. Chen received the Vermont State Medical Society's *Physician Award for Community Service*. He has served on numerous statewide boards addressing healthcare and medical issues, including as vice chair of the Vermont Board of Medical Practice. From June-September 2010, Dr. Chen served as Interim Executive Director of the Vermont Program for Quality in Health Care, where he was a board member since 2006. In addition, Dr. Chen is a member of the Board of Scientific Counselors of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Office of Infectious Disease, and a member of the Prevention Committee of the Association of State and Territorial Health Officials. Dr. Chen has spoken on the issue of health care reform nationally and regionally, including presentations to the U.S. Senate Health, Education, Labor and Pension Committee, the New Mexico legislature's Health Committee, and the New England Medical Society Leadership Conference.
