

ANN MATTA, CRNP-BC

As a BSN graduate from Widener University, my career in nursing started in 2005 as a critical care and emergency nurse in the US Army. Throughout my 8 years of active duty, I specialized in rotar wing critical care transport within the combat and stateside environments. I then transitioned to US Army reserves while completing graduate school at University of Maryland, and graduated with my Masters of Science in Nursing- Acute Care Nurse Practitioner and Critical Care Clinical Nurse Specialist in 2012. After graduation, I completed the NP Critical Care Fellowship at University of Maryland Medical Center (UMMC) and R Adams Cowley Shock Trauma Center (STC) in 2013. As an ACNP I worked as a senior NP within the Critical Care Resuscitation Unit, Lung Rescue Unit and Multi-Trauma ICU within UMMC/STC. In 2014, I became the coordinator for the UMMC/STC Critical Care NP fellowship. Additionally, I coordinate and teach several APP educational programs at the UMMC/STC, including The Core Concepts of ECMO Therapy Course, UMMC/STC APP Critical Care Bootcamp, FCCS and FCS Obstetrics.

She worked for seven years as a RN in the Coronary Care Unit and Cath/EP Lab before transitioning to advanced practice. Britney Broyhill graduated in 2006 from Vanderbilt University with a Bachelor's in Neuroscience. She then transitioned into Vanderbilt's School of Nursing (VUSN) ACNP master's program where she graduated in 2008. She practiced for two years as a hospitalist within Atrium Health at AH-Union. She then joined Atrium Health's trauma and surgical critical care team in 2010 at Carolinas Medical Center where she maintains an active practice. She completed her DNP at VUSN in 2013 with a capstone focused on surrogate decision making in traumatic brain injury.

In 2013, she joined the Center for Advanced Practice (CAP) at Atrium Health as the NP fellowship director. Britney was appointed first Chair of the Atrium Health Medical Group APP Committee in 2016, responsible for medical group advanced practice oversight and operations. She is a founding member and the immediate past president of the Association of Post Graduate APRN Programs (APGAP) the national advocacy organization for APRN fellowship programs where she testified for the IOM committee on the Future of Nursing Report. In early 2018, Britney was selected as the first Senior Director of Advanced Practice at Atrium Health serving as a member of the senior leadership team for the Atrium Health Medical Group and Assistant Vice President of the Center for Advanced Practice. In this role, she is responsible for clinical and operational optimization of APP practice, engagement, communication, oversight of regulatory compliance, outcomes and overall strategy of more than 1,200 APP providers. With the integration of the AH Wake Forest, AH Floyd, and AH Navicent APP workforce, Britney was promoted in 2022 to Chief Advanced Practice Executive, VP. This expanded her responsibility to over 3,000 APP providers in four different states over the Southeast Region of Advocate Health.

As the owner of several successful businesses outside of healthcare, Dr. Huynh's pragmatic approach allows for innovative solutions that are sustainable. She has counseled dozens of healthcare institutions throughout the US and Canada on NP education, workforce development and business strategies.


MICHAEL GLORIOSO, BA
