# UNIVERSITY DEVELOPMENTAL ASSESSMENT CLINICS (UDAC) EXPERTS EVALUATE CHILDREN AT RISK FOR DEVELOPMENTAL DELAY

## UDAC's assessment services include:

- Developmental pediatrics
- Psychology
- Genetics
- Neurology
- Audiology
- Speech and language pathology
- Occupational and physical therapy
- Care coordination
- Family support services

## Programs offered:

- Child Developmental Program (CDP)
- Neonatal Follow-up Program (NFP)
- Heart Center Neurodevelopmental Program (HCNP)
- Orthopedics Follow-up Program (OFP)

## CHILD DEVELOPMENTAL PROGRAM (CDP)

CDP evaluates, consults and provides case management for children and adolescents with any type of developmental need or concern, including the following:

- Autism spectrum disorder
- Speech and hearing concerns
- Behavioral and emotional challenges
- Developmental or physical delays
- Cognitive concerns

CDP clinics are held at all UDAC clinic locations.

Referrals can be made by a physician, educator or a concerned parent/guardian.

## NEONATAL FOLLOW-UP PROGRAM (NFP)

Infants who have spent time in the newborn intensive care nursery may be at a higher risk for developmental concerns, especially if born small, early or seriously ill. NFP is for infants who meet eligibility criteria or have developmental concerns.

NFP clinics are held in Salt Lake, Ogden and Provo.

Infants are referred to the NFP by their newborn intensive care unit, primary care provider or a parent can call us directly.

## ORTHOPEDIC FOLLOW-UP PROGRAM (OFP)

Infants and children with an orthopedic diagnosis and continued concerns may be able to visit an orthopedic specialist at one of our traveling clinics in Blanding, Moab, Price, Richfield, St. George, or Vernal.



## HEART CENTER NEURODEVELOPMENTAL PROGRAM (HCNP)

Children born with complex congenital heart disease are at an increased risk of developmental, learning and behavioral disorders. The HCNP is integrated into the child's ongoing care while he/she is in the hospital and also includes outpatient evaluations at UDAC.

The HCNP clinic is in Salt Lake City.

Patients are referred to the HCNP by a cardiologist or primary care physician. Parents or guardians may also contact HCNP directly.
