

Keynote Speaker Bess O'Brien

Many NPs from throughout Vermont work with patients who have mild to severe body image and eating disorders. We are pleased to have Vermont film director and producer Bess O'Brien as our 2017 keynote speaker on Friday, March 31. O'Brien is the director All of Me, a recently released feature length documentary film focused on the lives of women, girls, and some boys who are caught up in the downward spiral of eating disorders and their struggle to regain a sense of self-compassion and healing. Throughout and beyond, she has done much to raise awareness of on a multitude of social issues.

As a director/producer of the documentary film *The Hungry Heart*, she brought to the fore-front the prescription drug crisis in Vermont and the compassionate work of Dr. Fred Holmes. The film won the American Society of Addiction Medicine 2015 Award for outstanding media and was honored by Vermont Governor Peter Shumlin as the film that served as a catalyst for opiate addiction awareness in the state of Vermont.

Other award-winning documentary films by O'Brien include: Ask Us Who We Are, a powerful documentary about foster care in Vermont, Journey into Courage about women in the Northern part of Vermont who survived domestic violence and sexual abuse, Where is Stephanie about the murder of a young girl in Rutland, VT, and Here Today about Vermont families struggling with heroin in their lives. Bess O'Brien co-founded Kingdom County Productions with her husband Jay Craven in 1990. She is also the director/producer of the highly acclaimed feature film Shout it Out based on the lives of Vermont teens and the original Voices Project live musical.

Robin J. Lunge, JD, MHCDS is a Member of Vermont's Green Mountain Care Board. The Board is charged with designing and administering health care payment and delivery system reform as well as regulating the health care industry. Previously Lunge served as the Director of Health Care Reform for close to 6 years, coordinating health reform efforts. She also worked as a nonpartisan staff attorney at Vermont Legislative Council for 8 sessions and provided drafting and staff support in health and human services issues to members of the Vermont Legislature. Lunge worked at the Center on Budget and Policy Priorities in Washington D.C. as a senior policy analyst on public benefits issues in 2007. Her areas of expertise are federal and state public benefit programs, health care, and health care reform.


