Advising Notes
<p>*Extensive Program changes have occurred. Students are asked to work with their faculty advisor to insure they are enrolled in the proper courses.</p> <p>**This course requires placement testing because ENGL 101 eligibility is required</p> <p>The Photography certificate prepares students for entry-level employment in photography as they are taught the fundamental skills and techniques involved in traditional photography with added emphasis on the digital arena. Training is provided in both the aesthetic and technical principles of photography for entry-level job opportunities of artistic and commercial photographic application. In addition, this program may be taken for personal growth or for advancement by those already employed in some phase of photography or graphic arts. Students should understand that this field often requires an apprenticeship (photographic "assisting") of several years after graduation before higher level jobs are secured.</p>

This check sheet meets the requirements for the Certificate in Photography from HACC. Please note that this major is presented in a sequence of courses, many of which are only offered one semester a year. Students are urged to consult with their adviser for course selection. The complete program is offered only at the Harrisburg Campus. It is generally intended to be undertaken on a part-time basis. Courses are offered during the day and also offered evenings and weekends, but on a specific rotation. Please ask your adviser for this information. Students may also take General Education courses that will apply toward the AFA degree.

PLEASE NOTE: A portfolio will be required for a job interview.

Approximate Art Supply Cost

Students can expect to spend approximately \$100-\$300 per Art course.

A digital single lens reflex camera (DSLR) and a fully adjustable non digital single lens reflex (SLR) camera are required for all photography majors.
