<p>Advising Notes</p>
<p><u>Approximate Art Supply Cost</u> Students can expect to spend approximately \$30-150 per each ART course.</p> <p>HACC is committed to high academic standards that reflect current trends in the field in order to prepare students for a career in graphic and interactive design. These standards are intended to assure high-quality experiences in small classes with access to new technologies and superior media and library support. As a result, <i>this is a Selective Program and is only open to those who meet the entry criteria.</i></p> <p><u>Entry Criteria for AAS Degree Program (#2841):</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All students must first enroll in the Graphic and Interactive Design (GID) Foundations (#2831) curriculum. (Enrollment in GID Foundations curriculum does not guarantee admission into program #2841.) • Meet with the chair, a GID advisor or the Graphic and Interactive Design discipline lead to get specific information about the program's entry criteria. • Through coursework or testing, students must demonstrate readiness for ENGL 101 and Math 022 (All 0-level courses must be passed with a grade of "C" or better.) • Must complete or be enrolled in Art 105, 121, 176 and 125 pending a grade of "C" or better by the end of the semester to be eligible for admittance into the program. • Submit a portfolio of required artwork to the annual entrance portfolio review. (Students in program #2831 will be contacted by email regarding the date and requirements of the portfolio review.) • Students who have submitted portfolios will be contacted by email with the results of the review. <p>Students whose portfolios are accepted and who meet the above criteria are admitted into program #2841. Once accepted into program #2841, all GID curriculum courses must be taken without lapse between semesters, and in the required sequence. If a student drops or does not complete a GID curriculum course with a grade of "C" or better he/she is not eligible to remain in the program.</p> <p>Program #2841 is designed to lead directly to a career and is not intended for transfer. Students interested in transferring to another school after completing HACC's Graphic and Interactive Design program must contact the target school well in advance to determine their transfer requirements. While most of HACC's GID major courses are offered during the day, some courses are only available at night. All GID major courses are only available at the Harrisburg Campus. Some general education and all foundation courses are available at other campuses.</p> <p>GID students at HACC are trained to use industry-standard equipment and graphics software. Students will assemble a print and digital portfolio for job interviews that will demonstrate skills in concept making, digital imaging, layout, design, web, and interactive media.</p> <p><u>Career Opportunities</u> Job opportunities for GID graduates can be found in advertising agencies, design firms, magazines, television stations, web and multimedia production companies, retail stores, government agencies, corporate in-house art departments and more.</p>
