### Advising Notes:

- 1) Students must meet with their assigned counselor/advisor to discuss an educational plan.
- 2) All developmental coursework must be completed prior to submitting a clinical application.
- 3) C grade or higher is required in ALL coursework (developmental, general education and clinical courses).
- 4) \*\* **Students must demonstrate proficiency through MATH 091 BEFORE submitting a clinical application** (MATH 103) is also required and can be completed after applying or starting clinicals).
- 5) \* **CHEM 100** is required if a student did not complete high school/college academic or honors chemistry with a C grade or higher within the last 7 years. Grade is based on high school or college grading scale. Chemistry expires after seven years – from the date of completion to the start of clinicals. **If required, CHEM 100 must be completed BEFORE submitting a clinical application.** MATH 091 (or MATH 055) is the pre-req to CHEM 100.
