<b>English 102</b>	3cr	Pre-req: ENGL 101 with a grade of C or higher and completion of developmental reading
<b>Communications 101</b>	3cr	Pre-req: Eligibility for enrollment into ENGL 101
<b>Humanities and Arts</b>	3cr	Must be a Philosophy course - Recommend PHIL 225 Ethics: Belief and Action
<b>Humanities and Arts OR Natural and Physical Science</b>	3cr	If selecting Humanities & Arts select EITHER a literature course (ENGL 200-299) OR one of the following foreign language courses: SPAN 101, 102; FRENCH 101,102; GERMAN 101,102
<b>Math</b>	3cr	Elective Math (Recommend Math 202 –pre-req is MATH 080; or MATH 051 or MATH 055)
<b>Biology 111</b>	3cr	Introduction to Human Biology - Pre-req: ENGL 003, 007, or 057 with grade of C or higher
<b>Natural Science with lab</b>	3cr	Select Science with lab ASTRO 103, 104; BIOL 101,108; CHEM 101, 113; OR PSYS 201
<b>Psychology 101</b>	3cr	Pre-req: Completion of developmental reading sequence
<b>Sociology 201</b>	3cr	Pre-req: Completion of developmental reading and writing sequence
<b>Transfer Electives</b>	9cr	Check with transfer institution
<b>Wellness</b>	1cr	Check with advisor
<b>First Year Seminar</b>	1cr	Check with advisor

<b>HUMS 122</b>	3cr	Skills and Methods in Human Services II	Pre-req: HUMS 100 with grades of C or higher
<b>HUMS 200</b>	3cr	Group Work Practice	Pre-req: HUMS 121 with grades of C or higher
<b>HUMS 206</b>	3cr	Human Development in the Social Environment	Pre-req: HUMS 100 and ENGL 101 with grades of C or higher
<b>HUMS 215</b>	4cr	Fieldwork Practicum	Pre-req: HUMS 120, 122, 206 and 100 with grades of C or higher
