The Fire Science Technology AAS degree is designed to provide individuals with the technical and professional knowledge required to make decisions regarding fire protection for both the public and private sectors. This curriculum also provides a solid foundation for continuous higher learning in fire protection, administration, and management. This curriculum follows the U.S. Fire Administration/National Fire Academy's Fire and Emergency Services Higher Education (FESHE) Model for Professional Development.

*Course equivalency may be awarded for current Pro Board certifications. Certifications must be from the Pro Board Fire Service Professional Qualifications system and should be submitted for review and approval.

** Pa. Dept. of Health or National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians certification is equivalent to EMS 131 and EMS 132 and may serve as Free Elective.
