**Advising Notes**

The Police Science AAS degree provides students with the opportunity to obtain practical experience in the HACC Criminalistics Laboratory, one of the best-equipped crime laboratories in Pennsylvania. Students receive hands-on training in bloodstain pattern analysis, firearms examination, shooting reconstruction, police photography, crime scene processing, fingerprint analysis, polygraph, forensic pathology, and microscopy. This program may require the student to submit to an Act 34 Pennsylvania State Police Criminal Background Check prior to enrollment, prior to the start of a field experience, prior to testing and/or obtaining employment.
