This addendum concerns the changes in the Harrisburg Area Community College (HACC) Associate in Arts of Architecture program of study and the addition of:

GTEC 110: Construction Print Reading
ARCH 214: Site Planning and Surveying
ARCH 211: Architectural Graphics

to the Program-to-program Transfer agreement between Harrisburg Area Community College (HACC) and Temple signed January 14, 2013.


After the signing of that agreement, HACC revised their ARCH 110: Construction Printreading course to include additional topics. The course was re-named GTEC 110: Construction Print Reading.

In addition, HACC no longer requires MATH 121: Calculus I and PHYS 201 & 202: General Physics I & II for their program. These courses have been replaced with the 'Core C' option. Footnotes have been added to the Core C option which explains that students should select MATH 121 and PHYS 201 to fulfill their Core C requirement. These courses fulfill major requirements at Temple and students who select other courses will need additional semesters to complete their Bachelor's degree.

Lastly, students no longer take ARCH 130 or ARCH 135 at HACC. As a result ARCH 2151: Architecture, Technology, and the Environment and ARCH 3152: Materials and Methods have been added to the list of courses for students to complete at Temple.

This existing agreement has been updated to reflect these changes.



This addendum concerns the changes in the Temple University (Temple) Bachelor of Business Administration program of study and the addition of:

BA 2104: Excel for Business Applications

to the Program-to-Program Transfer Agreement between Harrisburg Area Community College (HACC) and Temple signed January 14, 2013.

As a result of the addition of this degree requirement at Temple, students are now strongly advised to complete CIS 135: Intermediate Spreadsheet Applications at HACC as one of their Transfer Electives. CIS 135: Intermediate Spreadsheet Applications at HACC transfers to Temple as BA 2104: Excel for Business Applications. BA 2104: Excel for Business Applications became a required course for all Bachelor of Business Administration degree programs beginning Fall 2014.


After the signing of that agreement, revisions to course numbers were made by the English department and Legal Studies department at Temple University. As a result, ENGL 102: Composition II at HACC now transfers to Temple as English lower level elective. BUS 209: Legal Environment of Business at HACC now transfers to Temple as LGLS 1101: Legal Environment of Business.


Beginning Fall 2012, students at HACC are required to complete MKTG 201: Principles of Marketing and MGMT 201: Principles of Management as part of their degree requirements. Previously, these courses were included in the agreement (Note 4) as recommended transfer electives. MKTG 201: Principles of Marketing and MGMT 201: Principles of Management are now listed on the agreement as required courses. A new note has been added which recommends that students complete CIS 135: Intermediate Spreadsheet Applications as a Transfer Elective at HACC.

Lastly, 4-semester grids have been provided for each Business Administration degree specialty area. These grids can be used to show students how they can complete their degree program at Temple in two years.

The existing agreement has been updated to reflect these changes.
