## CITY COUNCIL RUN-OFF ELECTION INFORMATION

Pensacola, Florida – Escambia County Supervisor of Elections David H. Stafford today released the following information regarding the November 25, 2008 run-off election to decide the Pensacola City Council, District 4 contest between Marty Donovan and Larry B. Johnson, and the District 7 contest between Jacqueline (Jacci) Shumaker and Ronald P. Townsend:

- Only registered voters in Pensacola City Council, Districts 4 and 7 are eligible to cast a ballot in this run-off. Eight precincts are involved: 14\*, 32, 35, 40, 46, 47\*, 48\*, and 56\*. **PLEASE NOTE:** precincts with an asterisk (\*) are partially in the City of Pensacola, and partially in Escambia County – only those voters in the City of Pensacola are eligible to vote in this election. Check your Voter Registration Information Card for your City Council district, if applicable, or contact the elections office.
- For this election only, the polling location for Precinct 48 will be the same as Precinct 14 – Mt. Zion Baptist Church, 528 W. Jackson Street; and the polling location for Precinct 47 will be the same as Precinct 56 – Escambia County Health Department/Environmental Health, 1300 W. Gregory Street. Voters in these two precincts are being notified by mail of the change. All other polling locations remain unchanged from the General Election.
- Absentee ballots are being mailed to all voters in this district for whom an absentee request is on file. Any voter may request an absentee ballot by contacting the Supervisor of Elections by mail, phone (850-595-3900), e-mail ([absentee@escambiovotes.com](mailto:absentee@escambiovotes.com)), fax (850-595-3914), or by using the online form at [www.EscambiaVotes.com](http://www.EscambiaVotes.com). Requests must include the voter's date of birth and the address where the ballot should be mailed. Requests must be received no later than Wednesday, November 19. Voted ballots must be received in the Elections Office no later than 7:00 p.m. on Election Day.
- Early voting is not available in this election. However, voters may cast an absentee ballot in person at the Elections Office beginning Wednesday, November 12.
