How to Buy Vintage Construction Supplies on eBay

What to Watch Out for

Vintage construction supplies that are heavily used, like [hammers](#) and other tools, should be examined closely for signs of disrepair. Reusing is wonderful for the environment, but customers must ensure that the item that they buy will withstand the demands of use. Customers should not be afraid to ask sellers questions about these goods to guarantee that the item they are admiring is worth the investment. Goods should be carefully examined to be sure that they possess all of the qualities shoppers are looking for, as well. For example, if customers are looking for a [glass doorknob](#) from the 1950's, they should be careful to note that the item is from that era, made of those particular materials, in working order with limited flaws. Again, questions regarding the item should be addressed to the seller.

Budget

Shipping is another point to consider. Larger and heavier items can cost more to ship. This will either be incorporated into the price of the actual item, or will be charged in a shipping rate. Items can often be available for pick up, which is sometimes noted on the listing. However, if it is not listed, do not rule out the possibility. For many sellers, shipping a large item is time consuming and a bit of a hassle, so if the option is not listed and the seller is not too far away, message the seller with the suggestion. It could work out to the benefit of both parties involved.

If you find a great number of seemingly irrelevant items, choosing different key words can help you find your ideal results.

Examining seller feedback is a great way for customers to be able to somewhat predict their own experiences with the seller. If the seller is known to ship in a timely manner and provide great correspondence, you can look forward to that seller being reliable. You should never be hesitant to ask the seller any questions about the item you are interested in. Since the seller is choosing this particular item to sell, they may be very knowledgeable about it and be able to provide a great amount of insight as to the items effectiveness for your intended use of it.
