

NESAT SEAFOOD HOUSE

BOPHANA CENTER

Founded by renowned Cambodian filmmaker Rithy Panh, this resource centre is dedicated to preserving audio-visual archives that were damaged under the Khmer Rouge. It organises a mobile cinema during the dry season, too. bophana.org



BEE VINTAGE AND CRAFT

The slow-fashion movement is gaining traction in Phnom Penh, and one shop driving this change is Bee Vintage and Craft. Located in a quiet alley, it sells second-hand and handmade clothing, accessories and shoes. fb.com/beevintagepp

HAPPY CAFÉ AND NOODLES
