

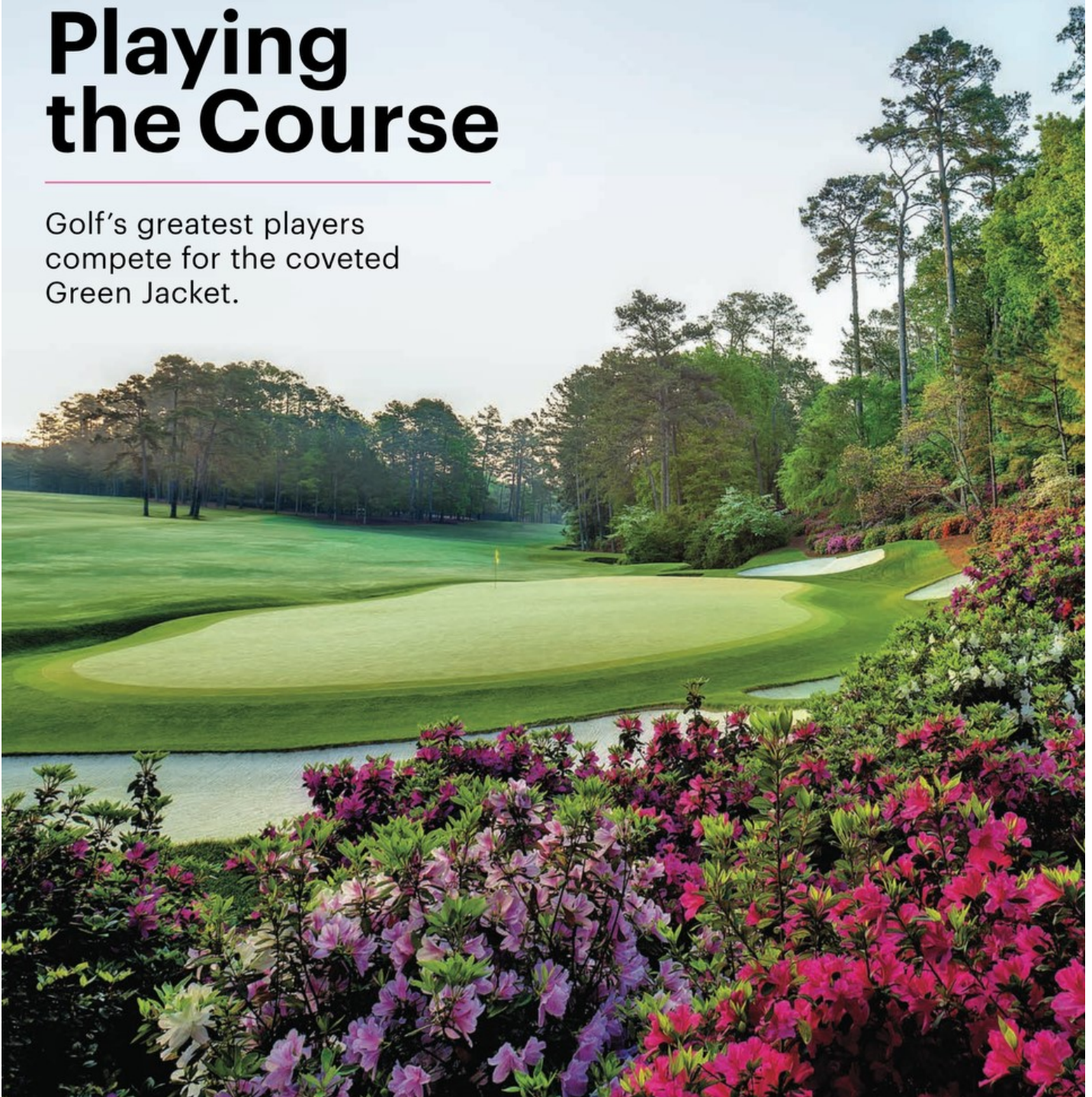

WHERE TO STAY Emiliano São Paulo

On the Rodeo Drive of São Paulo, this slim hotel is elegant and homey, attentive and relaxed. Don't miss the popular weekend brunch and the spa, which just unveiled a custom product line inspired by the nature-centric Paraty region. emiliano.com.br

◀ MORNING Helicopter Tour

WHERE TO STAY ▶

Hotel Ca'd'Oro

The city's original luxury hotel opened in 1953 and has been going strong ever since. Just reopened is the hotel's iconic Restaurante Ca'd'Oro, serving some of the best Northern Italian cuisine in the city. cadoro.com.br



BREAKFAST ▶

Mocotó Café

This sister spot to Esquina Mocotó and Mocotó Bar and Restaurant is more casual (i.e., paper plates), but the quality is high. Breakfast standouts include cassava brioche, tapioca pancakes and Brazil's beloved *pão de queijo* (cheese bread). mocoto.com.br

Hotel Unique

◀ MORNING

Street Art Tour

This three-hour graffiti tour covers top spots in the city, including the Open Air Street Art Museum and murals near Roosevelt Square. Private transportation and a guide trained by street artists are included. aroundsp.com/en/streetarttours

WHERE TO STAY ▶

L'Hotel Porto Bay São Paulo

Inspired by L'Hotel in Paris, this hotel features a large collection of French and Italian antiques and art. It also unveiled three junior suites with extra space and is located just three blocks from the renowned São Paulo Museum of Art. portobay.com

São Paulo Museum of Art

In addition to the permanent collections, a major exhibition of the work of Aleijadinho—an influential black sculptor and one of the most famous artists in Brazil—is being exhibited at the São Paulo Museum of Art through June. masp.org.br

◀ WHERE TO STAY Guest Urban

This affordable boutique option in the Pinheiros neighborhood has a loftlike vibe with polished concrete floors, art books, exposed brick and black-and-white prints. A small back garden and black bikes for hire round out the cool. guesturbansp.com.br

LATE MORNING ▶ Vila Madalena Walking Tour

Explore one of São Paulo's most energetic neighborhoods on this three-hour free walking tour (tips welcome), which includes local cuisine and cultural flavor, including the street art of Batman Alley and Aprendiz Alley. saopaulofreewalkingtour.com/vilamadalena



◀ AFTERNOON

Insider Shopping

Flavia Liz Di Paolo creates all kinds of private, bespoke tours, including a guided shopping tour focused on places to indulge your specific interests (fashion, art, jewelry, etc.), often with exclusive access to designers. flavializ.com



◀ DINNER D.O.M.

This much-lauded restaurant is helmed by chef Alex Atala, who presides over a growing empire of São Paulo restaurants. D.O.M. presents modern, innovative plates using Brazilian and Amazonian ingredients, such as pirarucu river fish, the tingly jambu jungle herb and more. domrestaurante.com.br

LATE-NIGHT DRINKS ▶ Frank Bar

Named one of the world's top 100 bars, this Hotel Maksoud Plaza bar serves finely crafted cocktails that have made it a favorite of chefs and foodies. maksoud.com.br/frank-bar-eng.html



◀ LUNCH Maní

Maní, from chef Helene Rizzo, is No. 9 on the list of Latin America's 50 Best Restaurants, with cuisine that expertly fuses European and Brazilian techniques and flavors—think cashew ceviche with cachaça and cajuína. manimanioca.com.br/gastronomia



◀ AFTERNOON Private Cooking Class

Learn classic Brazilian cocktails and dishes under the guidance of professional chefs such as Heloisa Bacellar, a Cordon Bleu-trained Brazilian chef and author. Classes often take place in the chefs' home kitchens. flavializ.com

DINNER Cór

This buzzy newcomer opened in 2017 in the Pinheiros neighborhood and is a collaboration with Peruvian meat master Renzo Garibaldi. No surprise, then, that meat is central to Cór. corgastronomia.com.br

LUNCH Fôrno

One of the newest places nudging the revival of downtown São Paulo is this relaxed eatery offering pizza, sandwiches and salads created with almost entirely house-made ingredients. There's an open kitchen and a chic bistro atmosphere. facebook.com/fornosp

AFTERNOON ▶ Custom Havaianas

The modern flip-flop was born in São Paulo in 1962, when Havaianas made its first pair inspired by Japanese Zori sandals. Today, Havaianas makes 11 pairs of flip-flops every second. Stop at its flagship store on Rua Oscar Freire and create a customized pair.



◀ EVENING

Music and Moonlight

The weather is mild in São Paulo in April, so head to Allianz Park on April 22 to see Radiohead take the stage as the band headlines the Soundhearts outdoor music festival. soundheartsfestival.com.br

LUNCH

Bar da Dona Onça

Innovative but approachable cuisine has made chef Janaina Rueda's 10-year-old eatery an institution downtown. It's often packed with locals enjoying favorites like chicken-filled *coxinhas* and *pastels* with ground beef. bardadonaonca.com.br



◀ EARLY AFTERNOON

Architecture Tour

This three-hour tour includes structures such as the Copan Building, MUBE by Paulo Mendes da Rocha and the USP Architecture School by Villanova Artigas. aroundsp.com/en/sparchtour



◀ DINNER

Esther Rooftop

Stick to the design theme at this Asian-influenced French bistro on the roof of the Esther Building, a 1938 modernist icon. Enjoy vast city views, cocktails and dishes such as crab croquette on creamed carrots with kaffir lime leaves. facebook.com/estherrooftop

LUNCH Hot Pork

When chef Jefferson Rueda's kids asked for hot dogs, the creator of A Casa do Porco delivered. He opened Hot Pork downtown, featuring handmade, gourmet, 100 percent pork or vegetarian hot dogs. facebook.com/hot.pork

AFTERNOON ▶ Soccer
