



Remember when winter vacation meant endless fun? Feeling wild and free in a world where snow turned everything into one big playground? That's Bend, Oregon, where there's always blue skies and fluffy powder, inviting mountains, endless forests and the coolest mountain town on the planet, beckoning you to roam, wander and explore.

Bend is where there are more ways to play in the winter than virtually any other winter destination. It's where you'll pop into skis or a snowboard at Mt. Bachelor and let gravity and fresh powder cast their spell. Sit back and zoom, inner tubing at the mountain's snow-park. Set your heel free — on cross-country skis, gliding on miles of pristine groomed trails through towering pines. Leap off-trail on snowshoes. Go full throttle, snowmobiling. Embrace your own call of the wild by dog-sledding.

Hike to a waterfall encased with icicles. Hop on a fat-tire bike and cruise on snow. Climb the sunbaked, sheer rock faces of river canyon walls.

After, hit the hot tub to soak your happy, spent self as you watch the sun set. Then let the aprèsadventure begin. Quaff your way through one of America's top craft beer towns (bendaletrail.com), brimming with hip eateries, music clubs, galleries, theaters, boutiques, and welcoming places to stay—from rustic to luxury. Check out Bend's impressive public artworks through the Roundabout Art Route or the Tin Pan Alley Art Collection.

Let your kids loose on sled hills, ice rinks and in snowball fights. Laugh 'til it hurts. Discover how winter mountains can make you feel warm all over. The sun is shining and the snow is falling in a place that's easy to get to and won't break the bank (kids ski free). Bend is where you'll remember how much fun a winter vacation truly can be.








Sun, snow and fun — three things you can count on happening in Bend this winter. At our doorstep is the Cascade Range, which logs about 30 feet of snow every winter. It's the perfect scenario. In town, there's just enough snow for postcard photos, while the major stash of the light, dry stuff is just minutes away. At Mt. Bachelor, high-speed quads serve nearly 3,700 acres of gorgeous, varied terrain up to 9,000 feet—the highest skiable elevation in Oregon and Washington (mtbachelor.com).

Before you descend from the summit, take in the staggering views of the surrounding Three Sisters mountains, shoulder to white shoulder in the sun. Ski the trees to find that great cache of powder. Hike the cinder cone for the thrill of running 700 vertical feet on a 40-degree slope.

Remember how much fun your first days of skiing were? It will all come back to you here, especially if your family is just learning. Expert instructors take kids up the free beginners lift along a gentle slope where their first ski memories are made. It's easy on the budget, too. Book a lodging package, and kids ski free.

On Mt. Bachelor's 35 miles of cross-country ski trails, glide among the pines and hemlocks in a national forest. Step out of the classic tracks and kick it up a notch on well-maintained skate ski trails. Afterward, at the rustic log cabin Nordic lodge, cozy up to the wood-burning stove and sip hot chocolate. And it doesn't stop there. Bend's snow parks offer miles and miles of groomed trails, including dog-friendly ones, too — all free.

Sure, you'll want to rush here, but with one of the longest ski seasons in North America, you can do it all in Bend through May.





Remember coming in from a day of play in the snow and how that first sip of hot cocoa felt? In Bend, you get that same feeling, whether you are sipping your way through our microbrew scene or sampling innovative local cuisine. Bask in the glow beside a fire pit at a hip pub, and kick back with locally distilled artisan spirits. Ah. the dead of winter comes alive.

Our light powder, the source of winter fun, is also the source of

our pure water, the prime ingredient in Bend's celebrated craft beers. Welcome to Beervana. Our little mountain town of 82,000 is home to the most breweries per capita in Oregon. Perfect days flow down from our ski trails and onto the legendary Bend Ale Trail (bendaletrail.com), the largest beer trail in the West. Sample beers from fourteen (and counting) microbreweries, each with its own

distinct IPAs, porters and pilsners — from Deschutes Brewery, Bend's first craft brew pub, to a Catholic-school-turned-hotel with its own brewery, multiple pubs, a restaurant, a movie theater, a warm soaking pool and meandering patios with outdoor fire pits. Throughout downtown Bend, the former timber town's historic streets are hopping with public art, theater and culinary experiences.

Taste how local juniper berries are reinterpreted as gin and why virgin snowmelt makes some of the finest vodka on the planet. Meanwhile, a day of play has worked up your appetite. Satisfy it with creative dishes at food carts, cafés, bistros and restaurants, where chefs fuse local ingredients and global influences to create a foodie haven that is distinctly Bend.
