Where to stay: W Barcelona is the place to be. A sail-shaped hotel that's located directly on the water's edge and nearby to the city centre, it offers a collection of 473 sophisticated rooms and the first Bliss Spa in Spain.

Number-one must see: Align your travel dates to watch a football match at the famous Camp Nou Stadium. No games on? Enjoy a stadium tour instead.

Where to stay: Being spoilt for choice in Venice is somewhat of an understatement. On the hunt for canal-side luxury and accommodation fit for royalty? It's a hard-pressed toss-up between The Gritti Palace, A Luxury Collection and Aman Venice Hotel – Grand Canal, Venice. Or, for something a little more secluded to revel in Venetian romance, Belmond Hotel Cipriani takes top billing.

After-dark destination: You can't go wrong with Teac Na Ceibe in Temple Bar Square for an ol' fashioned pint and authentic Dublin cheer




MONACO, A BLACK-TIE EVENT
