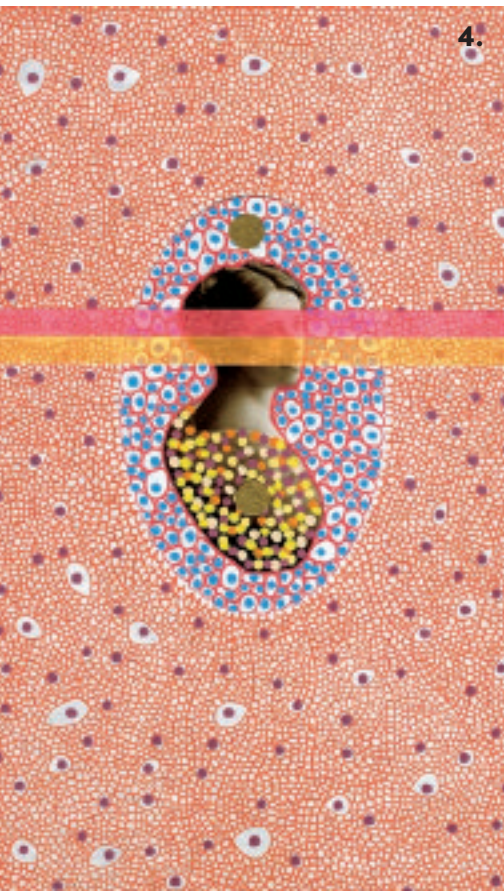
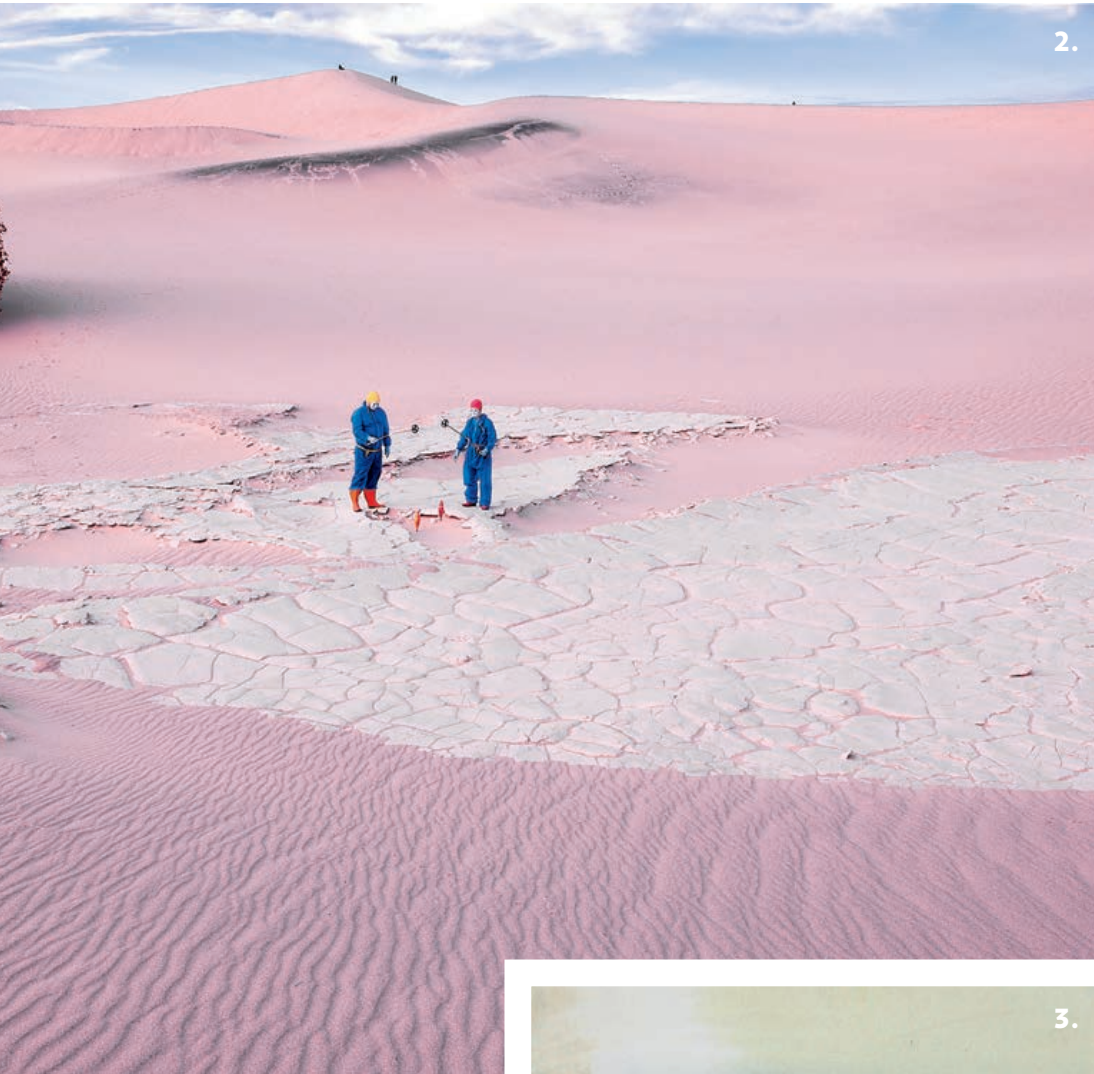

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**THIS ARTIST STITCHES HER SURROUNDINGS**

The sweeping fields, woods and rivers of South West England are turned into textile art through the embroidery of self-taught artist Victoria Rose Richards



***A Million Million Poppies in the Rain***

This cheery, colorful piece was the artist's first attempt at layering rain to create depth, utilizing a combination of stitching techniques. Feeling particularly inspired by her hometown in Devon, she took some artistic license by adding a multicolored sky.



***Geometry of the Land***

Richards created this captivating mosaic-like aerial by contrasting knots and satin stitch. It was inspired by the pastoral scene she sees from her bedroom window.



***What Sunshine is to Flowers***

Richards used varied thread weights in composing this piece depicting springtime, when the oilseed fields turn yellow. She says it evokes "the optimism and homeliness I feel from the landscapes around me."
