The outsized Ouijazilla celebrates its first anniversary in Salem. Massachusetts

SOME ARTISTS EXPRESS THEIR creativity with canvas or clay, but Rick "Ormortis" Schreck sticks to what he knows best: Quija boards. And his masterpiece. Ouijazilla, marks its first anniversary on October 12 infittingly—Salem, Massachusetts.

Measuring 3,168 square feet and weighing approximately 9,000 pounds, Ouijazilla is the world's largest Ouija board. Topping it off is a nearly 400pound planchette that glides with ease to make this mega magisterial board fully functional.

Schreck worked on the project for more than a year, using his own hand-drawn blueprints to



individually paint the sheets of plywood that make up Ouijazilla. Once plagued by procrastination, Schreck found the motivation to complete his effort after an epiphany he had while buying life insurance.

"I'm going into the fourth quarter of my life," he says. "I gotta start following through on every idea and leave behind some really cool memories." -JESSICA POITEVIEN
