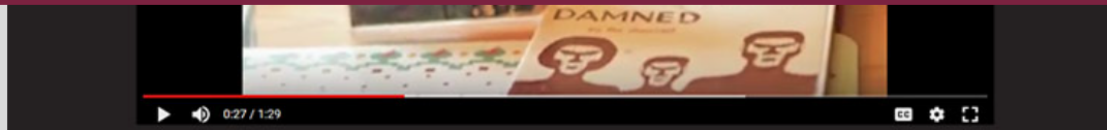

Patricia Murphy Robinson (1926–2013) was an anti-imperialist activist and left theoretician who authored seminal essays about black women, working-class politics, and socialism in the 1960s and 1970s. A Revolutionary Black Molecule**," and talk about the creative process of using documentary film to recapture the history of radical black women. In conversation with Robyn C.
