

# HALIFAX TO HAWORTH

Jump on a train from **Halifax train station** to **Hebden Bridge**. They depart at least every half an hour during the day and the journey takes less than 15 minutes.

Next up, all aboard the **Brontë Bus** (yes, its real name!), which leaves from **Hebden Bridge train station**. Take the **B3 towards Keighley** (there's one an hour).

After half an hour, you should reach **Sun Street** in **Haworth** – this is your stop! Ring the bell, alight on the left and walk up the picturesque cobbled street ahead. At the top of the hill, you'll arrive at the iconic **Brontë Parsonage Museum**.

This scenic bus route takes you up and over the Brontës' beloved moors...

Explore the colourful, independent shops and cafes of Hebden Bridge – an arty, historic mill town.

Many of the Anne Lister Festival venues are walkable from Halifax train station!

From the **Brontë Parsonage Museum**, walk down the cobbled Main Street until you reach Haworth Old Hall. Cross the road here and wait at **Sun Street bus stop** next to the church.

The bus you want is the **B3 Brontë Bus towards Hebden Bridge**. This arrives every hour. Alight after 30 minutes at **Hebden Bridge train station**.

From **Hebden Bridge train station**, catch the train to **Halifax**. There's one at least every half an hour during the day and it takes under 15 minutes.
