

JASON CORDOVA

G80 / COMPTON, CA / FEBRUARY 13, 2021

Jason Cordova specializes in documenting car culture, though it's the culture part of the equation that most interests him. "I love the cars, but it's the people that make the shot," he said.

Raised in Los Angeles, Cordova spent his day with the G80 taking it all around his city. Each location appeared to be a contradiction that somehow felt completely natural. He visited a palm tree-lined block of Freeman Ave. that's directly in the flight path of LAX, and went underneath the iconic 6th Street Bridge, which is currently covered in construction. "The G80 seems like it's at home anywhere," Cordova said.

Perhaps most striking was when he ventured to Taking Over Stables, a refuge for a group of horse-riding cowboys that's right in the middle of Compton. It's another unexpected revelation that makes total sense in a city as mixed-up and magical as L.A.

JEFF ZWART & RILEY HARPER

GV80 / PIKES PEAK HIGHWAY, CO / AUGUST 19, 2020

Acclaimed automotive photographer/director and car racer Jeff Zwart teamed with stunt driver and upstart photographer Riley Harper for a journey into the natural magnificence of Colorado. The pair started in Aspen before splitting up and embarking on a 24-hour photo mission to Pikes Peak, an inspiring range in the Rocky Mountains that reaches an elevation of over 14 thousand feet.

Zwart took his GV80 on the backroads, making stops in locales like a visually stunning stretch filled with white Aspen trees. Along the way, he mused on how his dual life pursuits shaped him. "The racing side of what I've done has really developed me as a photographer, and as a photographer, it's really developed my racing," he said. "Both things feed each other in an interesting way."









During his driving segment, Harper traveled over Independence Pass, pausing to photograph the GV80 against a backdrop of snow-capped mountains and in front of a sheer rock cliff. "Growing up in the film industry as I did, I have just been around filmmakers my whole life," he said. "Working as a stuntman and a stunt driver, I'm around [directors of photography] who set up so many amazing shots that I'm usually in. It's hard not to be into photography and filmmaking."

The two met up again just as the sun rose above the switchbacks that lead to the top of Pikes Peak. Taking in the view, Zwart remarked, "This is where I've raced for 18 years, and it's always magical."

Reveling in the kind of inspired attention to detail you won't find elsewhere, the 2021 Genesis GV80 delivers a staggering 33.9 cubic feet of cargo space behind the second row and statement-making design cues like diamond-patterned LED quad headlamps and available 22-inch wheels.

ESTEVAN ORIOL

G80 / DOWNTOWN LOS ANGELES, CA / MARCH 13, 2021

Estevan Oriol is a Los Angeles original. He's been making unflinching, unvarnished images of the city's people and places for decades. "For me it's all about pride and culture," he said.

Despite being an old school guy, Oriol embraced the challenge of photographing the ultra modern G80. "Shooting this car is like shooting a spaceship," he said. To balance such a futurefacing subject, Oriol opted for a throwback approach. He mostly used his collection of cameras from the 1970s and '80s, which still rely on film. Holding up a bag filled with undeveloped rolls, he joked, "These are prehistoric, like dinosaur footprints."

While digital photography now lets you know right away if you nailed the money shot, Oriol still prefers to wait and see what he gets back from the photo lab. That way, he's able to stay more firmly in the moment when he's on the job. And besides, when you've been a photographer for as long as he has, your body has a way of knowing when you got it. "You go off your instinct," Oriol said. "You go off what your heart tells you."

When the temperature pushed into the triple digits, Lisa Linke headed to Glamis Dunes, near where the borders of California, Arizona and Mexico meet. The German-born photographer teamed up with Rhys Millen, a racing driver from New Zealand, to see what the mighty GV80 can do in the sand. "I wanted to take the Genesis somewhere where it usually doesn't live, an environment where it doesn't usually drive," said Linke. "I was surprised it handled everything so well."

In the golden hours before the sunset and after the sunrise, Linke captured Millen drifting the GV80, catching the light as it streamed through the kicked-up sand. The resulting contrast between the luxury SUV and the sparse surroundings is visually astounding, a pure meeting of strength and beauty.







For Capitol Cuts, the renowned label Capitol Records invited rising musicians to its landmark building in the middle of Hollywood for a series of intimate events, powered by Genesis. Inside historic Studio A, the artists played live sets that were recorded straight to vinyl on vintage equipment. That meant there was no chance for overdubs, redos or corrections to what happened. During Capitol Cuts, the musicians had to balance two key, and often opposing, impulsesbeingfirmly in the moment when playing live, but also considering the posterity of recordings.





The garage plays a strange role in houses. They are simultaneously a part of the larger structure, yet they can seem so separate from it. In the best cases, they should feel fully integrated, both structurally and emotionally.

Too often garages become the places where people store the things they don't want to see anymore, or worse, what they don't want to think about. But shouldn't where we park our cars be so much more? Instead of depositories for outgrown clothes and underused boogie boards, we applaud those who recognize the possibilities of what a garage should be. A functioning, utilitarian refuge. A showcase.

Genesis partnered with Dwell Creative Services to highlight locations around Southern California that recognize the garage as a space for innovation. In the content series Escapes, we found a historic villa in the Hollywood Hills, where the carport's glass-encased walls create a natural interaction between what goes on inside the home and what happens on the street. For a multicultural modernist house in Venice, the garage is a gallery where the owner displays the art he's collected during his decades of international travel. At professional racer Tanner Foust's Huntington Beach escape, there's not only a hydraulic lift to accommodate two cars in the single-wide and double-deep garage, but the mirror in the upstairs bathroom has been replaced with glass so he can look out on his trophies and racing gear as he brushes his teeth.

These homes and the others rightfully turn the garage into a place of pride.




