The season of sparkle is upon us, with sequins beckoning from a forgotten corner of the wardrobe. When it comes to jewellery, it can be easy to veer into a world of novelty pieces. If a Christmas tree brooch floats your boat, go for it. If not, Jessica Burrell has a more subtle approach

“At Christmas, I never feel the need to dress in a way that screams festive. I prefer to keep things pared-back – clean shapes, a beautiful dress – and let the jewellery carry the mood,” says Nishita Assomull, founder of demi-fine jewellery brand, L'Atelier 73. “I think you can capture the essence of the season without a single snowflake. For me, it's all about form, texture and the way pieces move with the light.”

A great way to achieve this is with dainty pieces that glint without being overpowering – Astrid &

Miyu's crystal drop studs are a prime example. “If the piece has sparkle or metallic shine, I'd lean into contrast of finish,” says Anna Jewsbury, artistic director of London-based accessories brand Completedworks. “A polished or subtly glittering piece looks especially modern against matte textures: wool, brushed cotton, washed silk. It keeps the sparkle feeling considered and contemporary.”
