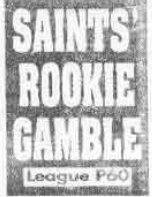

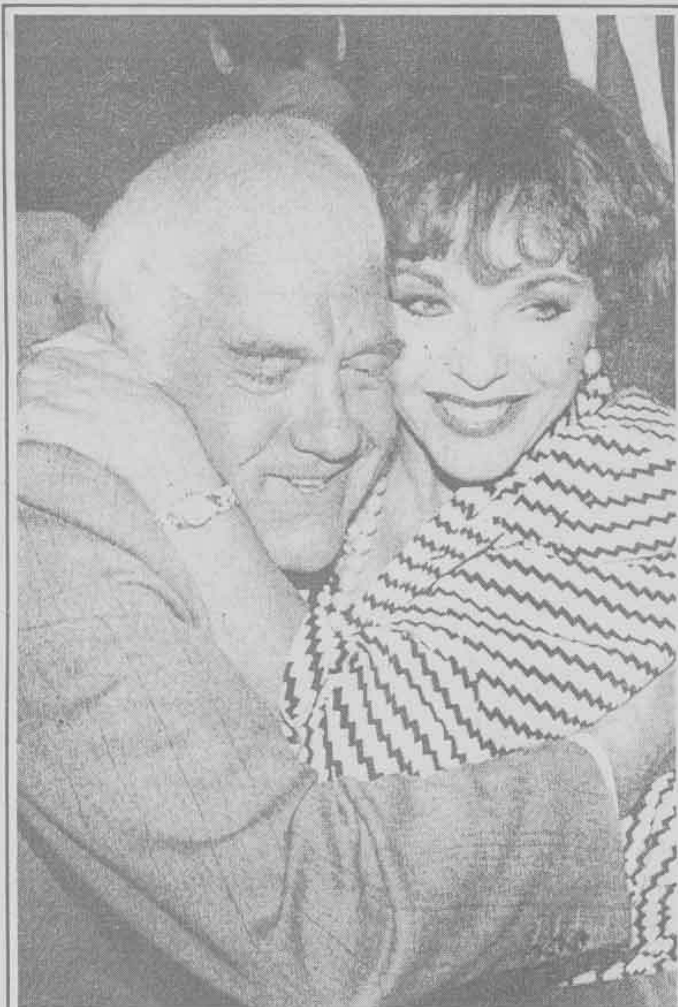

**MILLIONAIRE** lawyer to the rich and famous Marvin Mitchelson faces 12 years' jail and a \$1 million fine after being found guilty of tax fraud.

The Hollywood lawyer, who reached the peak of his fame after successfully handling Joan Collins's divorce in 1987, is in a Los Angeles jail awaiting sentence in April.

The publicity-loving lawyer, known as "the prince of palimony", kept his head bowed and said nothing as a jury found him guilty.

The case was the result of a three-year investigation in which many of Mitchelson's famous

# TUNNEL SPEED TRAP HAUL

**POLICE** are using radar traps to catch at least five motorists a day driving at more than 130km/hr in the Sydney Harbour Tunnel.

Highway patrol officers today claimed the tunnel was fast becoming a traffic blackspot less than six months after it was officially opened to the public.

A recent blitz found motorists averaging 88km/hr in the 70km/hr zone - with dozens recorded exceeding 100km/hr.

A spokesman for North Sydney Highway Patrol said "an extremely high number of motorists" were clocked doing speeds in excess of 180km/hr.

"We would book at least five vehicles a day doing more than 130km/hr and at least three to four a week doing up to 170km/hr," the spokesman said.

Last week two teenagers appeared in North Sydney court after they were caught driving through the tunnel at more than 120km/hr last year.

Both were fined \$800 and banned from driving for two years.

It's a deterrent which police hope will prompt more motorists to stick to the 70km/hr speed limit in the tunnel.

North Sydney Highway Patrol officers intermittently set up radar traps inside the tunnel to catch motorists who continue to flout the speed limit.

They are also using radar-equipped patrol cars and unmarked cars.
