

Parent, actor, and activist Cynthia Nixon welcomed everyone to the recent launch of North Star Fund's Education Justice Fund and called the quality of our public schools "a measure of economic justice." She thanked North Star Fund for supporting the Urban Youth Collaborative and the Coalition for Educational Justice, dynamic organizations that represent parents, students, and advocates for better schools. "The school system only works when everyone's voice is heard," Nixon continued. "We don't need top-down leadership and committees with no power. We need a grassroots movement."

On the day Superstorm Sandy hit, Jorge Gonzalo of Far Rockaway watched eight feet of water cascade in waves down his street, uprooting trees and overturning cars in its path. Jorge's home of 32 years was severely flooded in the storm. As he worked to clean



up in the days that followed, he noticed mold growing on the drywall in the basement. Though he and his son removed the drywall, the mold quickly spread to the foundation of his home. After attempting to remove the mold, he and his son began to feel ill, and as the mold continued to grow, they realized they were ill-equipped for the task.
