azz strains drift over the dark wood tables and mingle with the murmur of conversation. People enjoy pints of their favorite beverages with dishes of nuts, cheese and cottage pie. Small and homey, the high ceilings at Covent Garden in Machida feature a friendly atmosphere and frequent live music.

Located only five minutes from JR or Odakyu Machida Stations, the Irish



pub is an oasis offering respite from the bustling streets below.

Snacks and appetizers from the English food menu include fried mushrooms, salmon spring rolls or a cheese plate; heartier offerings like a sausage combo or chicken curry are also available. Patrons can also choose from over 30 beers, single- and double-malt whiskies and scotches up to 21 years old. You can also order special soft drinks, like a mango smoothie or citrus honey soda.

Owner Hiroki Honma wanted a place where you could meet new and old friends: "I lived and worked in the UK for two years as a software engineer. I went to a lot of British and Irish pubs and was really impressed by them."

Now open for over three years, his vision has been realized. Happy

patrons chat with the bilingual staff across the bar and at tables dotting the space.

The pub hosts live music events several times a month. Mocha, a jazz group, plays their original music twice a month. The four-piece group includes a five-string bass, flute, guitar and snare drum played with brushes. Their mellow sound allows guests to relax and talk without being drowned out.

Also on the calendar are occasional piano-night jam sessions, led by the owner and joined by other instrument-playing customers. "If you play an instrument, please join in!" said Honma.

Upstairs from Covent Garden is Shamrock Garden, a large space used for bigger concerts and parties. DJ nights are regularly held, starting at 10 p.m. and continue until 5 a.m. They play an eclectic mix of rock, hip-hop, house, Irish music and more.


"There are no nightclubs in Machida and I was often asked about it, so I decided to open this place," explained Honma. They also open the upstairs for big sporting events, including a Beijing Olympics party with games projected onto a large screen.

Stop by for a bite or a drink, to play darts and watch soccer or just dance and listen to music. If you don't have a friend to bring, make a new one there!

than feasting.

On stage, the performers entertained the crowd with traditional Bangladesh songs and belly dancing. One of the notable performances was by DJ Shopon. He fused traditional Indian music mixed with cutting edge cyber-trance beats. Shopon will hold a Bollywood Hungama event on June 28 starting at 6 p.m. at Roppongi's Wall Street House. The live event will include northern Indian classical kathan dancers as well.

Plenty of vendors also hawked their wares on site. Jewelry was the biggest display as well as traditional clothing. The vendors were outgoing and willing to negotiate on price, often for no other reason than the sport of it. Romana Jewelers, whose shop is located in Akihabara and Harubaruya of Shibuya had an impressive showing of jewelry and accessories.

On the other side of the bridge, two free raves went on attracting the usual eclectic mix of people from around the world. Raligerila drew over 100 people with five DJs spinning cyber-trance and hardcore techno beats. The group earned some money by selling canned drinks out of coolers.

Hosting a smaller event, but no less intense, was the group Odoru. DJ Hiro and her husband DJ Ryuji team up to create "S.D.E." (Sound, Dance, Enjoy). Hiro made a strong fashion statement with her bright orange hair offset by a deep blue silk "yukata," or summer dress.

"It's a rather grueling schedule that we have," she said. "We actually deejayed all night at a friend's house until 5 in morning, went home, caught a couple of hours sleep and then arrived at the park around noon. We make very little from these events, but we're very passionately trying to promote our group."

Hiro said her group is experimenting with different promotions. "We are currently trying to work with foreigners to promote our music because it's a huge untapped market. Lots of foreigners go to clubs in Shibuya, Shinjuku and Roppongi."

The Bangladeshi bash was a great way to spend the day. Of course, a day at Yoyogi Park is always great if weather permits. There is always something or someone there to make the day worthwhile.

Summer in Yoyogi Park


Koen **7**oyogi I (Park) has come a long way since it's days as an airstrip for Japan's first powered-aircraft flight in 1910. Once the site of housing for U.S. occupation forces, it was made a public park three years after hosting events for the 1964 Olympics. Tokyo Today, it is home to a variety of public events – especially in the summer.

The most notable events occur on Sundays. All along the walkways, street

venders sell Japanese fast foods such as "takoyaki," battered and fried octopus treats, "yakisoba," savory stir-fried noodles, as well as beer and soft drinks. Food stands serving up foreign foods are also common, especially if the event theme is ethnic. During the Thai foods festival held recently, shops sold Thai curry and noodles.

Flea markets are held often. During some of the larger flea markets, expect to find just about anything short of a business suit. Crafts, likewise, cover a wide variety of looks and styles.

Large events usually see use of the stage. Expect the park to be packed tree to tree and long lines at the restrooms. Entertainment currently in vogue at Yoyogi runs the gamut from hardcore

trance music and reggae to children's entertainers.

Across the bridge on the Harajuku side is where many music events take place. Almost every genre is performed on various Sundays. Talent scouts frequent this area to look for the next "Japanese Idol."

Further down the road, many DJ events take place. In addition, reggae and other types of music serenade big events. These

shows often attract some of the wildest fashions. You may witness anything from gothic Lolita to animation-character costumes to hardcore punk as well as the latest trends by ladies from the Shibuya side.

For something more traditional you can visit Meiji Shrine. The shrine is dedicated to the deified spirits of the Emperor Meiji and his wife. They are still celebrated as being highly influential figures in Japanese history. The temple often hosts weddings and other formal ceremonies.

So whatever you're hankering to hark, nibble or goggle at, on any given summer Sunday, Yoyogi Park is likely not to disappoint.


























Take me out to the ball game

raving a good game of baseball? Are you curious to experience another aspect of Japanese culture? You can do both if you head over to the Goodwill Dome in Saitama to catch the Seibu Lions play.

The Seibu Lions are one of Japan's 12 professional baseball teams. Their home stadium is the closest to Yokota Air Base. Getting there is easy. You can drive, take a train, ride a bicycle or hop a ride on a tour bus sponsored by Information, Tickets and Travel (ITT).

Admission fees range from 600 yen to 4,500 yen. If you drive, you will need an additional 1,000 yen for stadium parking. I suggest taking the ITT tour. The \$40 cost for adults covers bus transportation and a ticket in the stands. In addition, you can watch the game with familiar folks from the base. This is comforting when you become perplexed as to what exactly the Japanese fans are doing at any one time.

Even non-baseball fans should check out a game before they leave Japan. At a Lions game, you might find yourself watching the fans as much as, if not more than, the two teams playing.

Lions fans stand on their feet singing, chanting and making noise the entire time their team is at bat. Then the fans respectfully sit down, allowing the visiting team to get loud for their own batters. Specific chants exist for individual players, specific innings and for the entire team.

After the seventh inning, a special event occurs. Not to be confused with the seventh inning stretch, fans from both teams let loose their inflated color-coded balloons!

Last but not least, Japanese baseball wouldn't be complete without the female vendors who sell an assortment of goodies in the aisles. You can also try the Japanese fare. Once you return to the U.S., you will have a hard time finding octopus pancakes, curry over rice, or soba noodles at any sports complex.
