Ranch sorting is the No. 1 sport in horseback riding that evolved from the common ranch work of
separating cattle into pens for branding, doctoring, or transport. Ranch Sorting is an event that pits a
team of two riders on horseback against the clock. The sport is sanctioned by the Ranch Sorting
National Championships (RSNC) and is guided by the rules and judges from the RSN, which has
19,000 members strong. Its goal is to preserve the heritage and integrity of the ranching lifestyle
while providing a family oriented, competitive riding experience at the grassroots level.
