Pastoral Search Narrative

The First Baptist Church of Willowick is waiting upon the Lord for a Pastor whose love for our congregation emanates undeniably from his love for God. His love for The Lord is evident in his personal life through his commitment to the Spiritual disciplines of Scripture study, prayer, and fasting. He is growing in his personal relationship with the Lord and is above reproach in all areas of his life. His passion for The Lord overflows into a love and compassion for God's people. His compassion for our people will be evident in his desire to build relationships that will equip our people for ministry inside and outside of our church. He will pray for our congregation regularly and be given to praying with them at the time of their need.

His pulpit ministry will be motivated by the Spiritual gift of teaching and he will be given to expository preaching of the Word. He will desire to shepherd our people toward a growing relationship with the Lord through regular Bible study, prayer, and fasting. Through his preaching, he will seek to equip our congregation for works of service that we would have a heart for sharing God's truth with our community.

In church administration, he will have experience in leadership in a variety of roles in ministry. He will seek to disciple and encourage members of our congregation toward assuming leadership roles in the various ministries of our church.

Congregational Narrative

Our church members indicated that we have a continued hunger for God's Word and fellowship within our church body, about 1/3 noting they desire a deeper knowledge of God and abilities or outlets for living out their faith practically. There is a lot of latitude in who we can extend an invitation to because many are not giving preference to age or marital status. There is an interest in a biblical education and even seminary, along with some outside professional experience and minimally 5 years pastoral/church-related experience.

The desired experience in a pastor are in the areas of preaching, teaching, counseling, church growth, and visitation. Again, there was a strong leaning toward fellowship and ministry both within our community and worldwide missions, as well as family ministry. The priorities we desire in a future pastor lined up with this; pulpit ministry, evangelism/outreach, and teaching being in the top 3 areas. From the additional comments section, specific characteristics of a pastor that stood out are: faithful obedience, humility of spirit, compassionate, marked by joy and love, hospitable in nature, one who can communicate clearly God's Word both in word and by example. The word shepherd was used throughout the comment areas.

It was encouraging that so many of those who completed the survey didn't skip over the latter pages concerning church objectives and goals, current strengths and weaknesses, the purpose of the church and how to achieve perceived purposes. There is a sense that we are faithful to the Lord and to one another, that we are generous with our financial resources and in our service toward building up one another. We do have a heart for our community. Some are concerned that there not be a spirit of bitterness about the events that brought us to this place. We have a desire to grow in our ability to worship the Lord through music and our prayerfulness. The statement that best summarized what we indicated church is and what we want ours to look like is: "to worship God, to minister to (serve) one another and to impact the world for Him." Those who took the time to complete the survey seem to be mindful that we each have a responsibility to be faithful first in our own walk.





Population by age range




Population by age category






















