# **Definitions**

*Missions*: evangelizing and making disciples, i.e. *fulfilling the Great Commission*, outside one's own geographic and cultural community in whatever forum is acceptable in the targeted country and suitable to the missionary's gifts and experiences.

### **Definitions**

**Short Term Missionary** - Two years or less **National** – person engaged in Christian vocational ministry in his own country.

#### **The Great Commission**

#### Matthew 28:19,20

<sup>19</sup> Go therefore and make disciples of <u>all</u> <u>nations</u>, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

#### **The Great Commission**

Matthew 16:18, ". . . upon this rock I will build my church."

- Establishes the <u>unity</u> of the entire body of Christ(or the "universal church").
- 2. Acts 2:37-47 establishes the beginning of the 'local church.'

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#### Acts 2:37-47

<sup>37</sup> Now when they heard *this*, they were pierced to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, "Brethren, what shall we do?" <sup>38</sup> Peter *said* to them, "Repent, and each of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. <sup>39</sup> For the promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off, as many as the Lord our God will call to Himself." <sup>40</sup> And with many other words he solemnly testified and kept on exhorting them, saying, "Be saved from this perverse generation!"

#### Acts 2:37-47

- <sup>41</sup> So then, those who had received his word were baptized; and that day there were added about three thousand <sup>1</sup>souls. <sup>42</sup> They were continually devoting themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer.
- <sup>43</sup> Everyone kept feeling a sense of awe; and many wonders and signs were taking place through the apostles. <sup>44</sup> And all those who had believed were together and had all things in common; <sup>45</sup> and they *began* selling their property and possessions and were sharing them with all, as anyone might have need.

<sup>46</sup> Day by day continuing with one mind in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, they were taking their	
meals together with gladness and sincerity of heart, <sup>47</sup> praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord was

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Foundation of Missions	
3. Philippians 4:15-19 establishes	
the <u>connection</u> of a local church supporting a 'missionary' in the	
work of the ministry.	
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Philippians 4:15-19	
<sup>15</sup> You yourselves also know, Philippians, that at the first preaching of the gospel, after I left Macedonia, no church shared with me in the matter of giving and receiving but you	
alone; <sup>16</sup> for even in Thessalonica you sent <i>a gift</i> more than once for my needs. <sup>17</sup> Not that I seek the gift itself, but I seek	
for the profit which increases to your account. <sup>18</sup> But I have received everything in full and have an abundance; I am amply	
supplied, having received from Epaphroditus what you have sent, a fragrant aroma, an acceptable sacrifice, well-pleasing to	
God. <sup>19</sup> And my God will supply all your needs according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus.
