ARIZONA:

John Skelton will be the Week 1 starter, but we can't really promise how long he'll keep the job. Ken Whisenhunt's delay before revealing that Skelton had edged out **Kevin Kolb** for the job suggests that either he had difficulty with the decision himself or that there were conflicting feelings within the organization. "There's no guarantee going forward that Kevin won't be playing for us or won't be the starter," Whisenhunt says. As we've pointed out before, the Cardinals won more with Skelton last season (6-2 versus 2-6 with Kolb), and since he's better at getting rid of the ball, he has a better chance of staying healthy behind one of the league's worst offensive lines. He was a little bit better than Kolb in the exhibitions. But his only fantasy value is as a possible fill-in quarterback when the Cardinals have a choice matchup against a weak pass defense. Arizona, recall, actually put up above-average passing numbers last year, flaws and all. The only receiver of note, **Larry Fitzgerald**, seems to benefit; in eight games with each last year he caught 5 TDs from Skelton and just 2 from Kolb. ... While most of the national interest is in Arizona's quarterback competition, the running back battle is more significant from a fantasy perspective. Unfortunately, it was no more decisive. **Beanie Wells** and **Ryan Williams**, each coming off knee surgery, each appeared in two preseason games. Williams looked pretty good while averaging 5.0 yards per carry, but it was on only 8 attempts. Wells was down at 3.6 yards per attempt, but had a solid outing in the final exhibition: 7 carries, 35 yards, so also 5.0 yards per attempt. We anticipate a committee, possibly with the two splitting snaps right down the middle. Williams has more receiving ability, Wells is bigger with a nose for the goal line (10 TDs last year). An injury setback opens the door for one to have more chances, but the Cardinals could elevate another back into the committee. Rookie **William Powell** had a strong preseason, averaging 5.9 yards per carry (although mostly against reserves). **LaRod Stephens-Howling** will play on some third downs. We're not optimistic that Arizona will have a top-40 running back. The fact that they have one of the league's worst offensive lines is just an additional obstacle for their runners to overcome. ... **Michael Floyd** had a disappointing preseason, with reports coming out that suggested the first-rounder's

work ethic and comfort level were lacking. So it was nice to see him make a spectacular touchdown grab in the final exhibition, tipping a high throw to himself and pulling it in while landing on his back in the end zone. Floyd will open the year behind Andre Roberts and slot receiver Early Doucet, but plays like that indicate that they'll make an effort to work him in. He could emerge as a valuable fantasy option in 2013.

ATLANTA:

Jacquizz Rodgers looks like an up-and-coming player – maybe a poor man's Maurice Jones-Drew. He's small (5-6, 196), but he's a lot more versatile than Michael Turner, and he's a better fit with what the Falcons are trying to do. And he's a whole lot more comfortable in his second year. He carried 22 times for 85 yards and 2 TDs in the preseason, and he also caught 6 passes. He won't dislodge Turner from the starting lineup, but they'll get him involved. Last year he ran for 205 yards and a touchdown and caught 21 passes. This year, he may move up to something like 400-500 rushing yards and 40 receptions. And if Turner (who's 30) misses any time, Rodgers could put up some very intriguing numbers. With his receiving production, he'd put up more total yards per game than Turner. We see Rodgers as one of the best of the handcuff running backs. ... We're not sure who's the best receiver after Calvin Johnson, but **Julio Jones** is definitely in the mix. He's big and fast, allowing him to score long touchdowns from all over the field. And now that he's been around for a year, they'll use him more on shorter routes as well (like around the goal line). Jones was the intended target last year on only one pass inside the 10 (an incompleteness). He caught 2 of those balls in the preseason, including a touchdown. We are high on Jones.

BALTIMORE:

This could be the year **Joe Flacco** gets over the hump. He's been a solid, "game manager" type quarterback his first four years. He's 44-20 as a starter. But they've always relied more on their defense and running game. Flacco has averaged exactly 226 passing yards in each of his last three seasons. He threw 20 TDs last year, down from 25 in 2010. Now it looks like they'll ask him to do much more. They ran a lot of no-huddle stuff in the preseason, and he looked comfortable with that. He completed 72 percent of his passes, with a 3-1 ratio of touchdowns to interceptions and a 101.6 passer rating. This could be the year, it seems, where he moves up to something like 26 TDs and about 245 passing yards per game. We expect Flacco will be undervalued in most drafts. ... A shout out

is also in order for the wide receivers.

Torrey Smith was just a rookie trying to win a starting job last year. Now it looks like he knows what he's doing. He should be the No. 1 option. And **Anquan Boldin** seems to fit better in this offense. Last year they tried to use him on too many downfield routes. He averaged 15.6 yards per catch (that's good), but he finished with only 57 receptions, 887 yards and 3 TDs. It looks like they'll use Boldin in the slot a lot more often this year. He won't average as many yards, but he should catch a lot more passes. ... **Bernard Pierce** seems to have done enough to win the backup tailback job. He's the back to handcuff behind Ray Rice, in our opinion. The Ravens also have **Bobby Rainey**, but he looks like more of a third-down back.

BUFFALO:

Scott Chandler is a guilty pleasure at tight end. A seemingly limited player (he's been dumped by two other teams) but he's got some ability. He caught 83 percent of the passes thrown his way last year, the best by any tight end in the last five years. And they'll use him around the goal line. He caught 6 TDs in 14 games last year. Against a week ago, they flanked him outside, as kind of a featured wide receiver, for two plays from the 1. He was a decoy on one of those plays. On the other, they threw to him but the throw wasn't on target. We're not saying Chandler is a Gronkowski/Graham kind of guy. He caught only 38 passes last year. But he has a good chance to rank in the top 10 in touchdowns among tight ends. ... The Bills traded for **Tarvaris Jackson**, but they might not be ready to give him the No. 2 quarterback job right away. They're also apparently keeping Tyler Thigpen. Jackson will get that job once he's up to speed. ... The Bills released wide receivers **Marcus Easley**, **Derek Hagan** and **Naaman Roosevelt**, clarifying their situation at that position. **Stevie Johnson** is the clear No. 1 receiver. He looks good. **Donald Jones** and **David Nelson** also will be out there pretty much full-time (this is a three-receiver team). Rookie **T.J. Graham** is the guy they'd like to work in. Unlike those three, he's got the speed to take the top off a defense. In a dynasty format, we'd select Graham before Jones or Nelson (assuming the guys didn't need to play in 2012).

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CAROLINA:

The Panthers are going with **Justin Medlock** as their kicker. That's the plan, anyway. They cut Olindo Mare. But Medlock missed 50- and 56-yard field goals at Pittsburgh. He doesn't have a lot of room for error. If Medlock struggles early on – maybe misses a big field goal – the team could make a quick move to one of the many serviceable veterans who are looking for jobs. Medlock was very steady in the CFL last year, connecting on 49 of 55 field goals. ... **Steve Smith** has been out with a foot infection, but he's expected to play in the opener. He returned to practice on Sunday. He's the clear No. 1 receiver. ... **Greg Olsen** will play better this year. He shared time with Jeremy Shockey last year. Now Olsen is pretty much the team's only receiving threat at tight end. We disagree with Ron Rivera's lofty claim that Olsen could be another Gronkowski or Graham, but his numbers should improve. ... **Jonathan Stewart** (ankle) didn't practice Sunday, so it looks unlikely that he'll play in the opener. He definitely wouldn't fill his usual role. With him gimping, **DeAngelo Williams** should be used more than usual early in the season. ... **Cam Newton** doesn't look dramatically better as a passer. He completed 50 percent of his passes in the preseason.

CHICAGO:

The offensive line looks like the big weakness with this team. It's a bottom-5 group, and that will make it tough for the offense to put up average numbers. Pass protection and run blocking will be problematic, and that's tough to overcome. ... **Brandon Marshall** is the clear No. 1 receiver, but the Bears will have a below-average passing offense. That's partially due to the offensive line, and it's also by design. Chicago is a team that will try to play it safe and grind things out on the ground. We don't see much difference between the three wide receivers behind Marshall. **Devin Hester** will start, **Earl Bennett** might be just as productive out of the slot, and they'll also work in rookie **Alshon Jeffery**. Jeffery has the best size-speed combo of all of the receivers, and they'll try to take advantage of getting him in some mismatches. That could include some slant-route type stuff in the red zone. In a dynasty format, Jeffery comes in way ahead of Hester or Bennett.

CINCINNATI:

BenJarvus Green-Ellis has been dealing with a foot injury, but he'll be ready for Week 1; he returned to practice last week. Less certain is **Bernard Scott**, who had surgery for a hand injury and didn't play in the preseason. Scott says he'll play in Week 1, but it's not certain. He hasn't practiced yet. "My eyes show me better than I hear," Marvin Lewis says. Green-Ellis won't play full-

time; the Bengals will use **Brian Leonard** on third downs. But until Scott is back on the field, Green-Ellis should get nearly all of the rushing attempts. A possible sign that Scott's injury isn't a long-term concern: Cincinnati cut sixth-rounder Dan Herron. ...

Andy Dalton took a shot to his throwing arm in the exhibition finale, but he's fine; said he could have returned if it was the regular season. We're not expecting great numbers out of Dalton, but he should at least be a serviceable fantasy backup. The AFC North is populated by defenses that defend the run better than the pass, and Cincinnati's running game might be shorthanded early in the season. ... **Jermaine Gresham** has been sidelined with a sprained knee, but the team also expects him to be ready for Week 1. We think he'll have a bigger role than any of the wideouts after A.J. Green. ... The other starting receiver apparently will be **Armon Binns**. He started all of the preseason games. But we don't envision Binns doing much. He may lose some playing time to **Brandon Tate**. **Andrew Hawkins** will play in the slot and might catch more passes than either of those rookies. The Bengals drafted a couple of receivers (**Mohamed Sanu** and **Marvin Jones**) but we don't think either of those guys will play much. Sanu closed the preseason with 8 catches for 80 yards, but he didn't play at all with the first-unit offense in any of the games.

CLEVELAND:

Don't fall asleep on **Trent Richardson**. You have to take him sight unseen. With the knee injury, he didn't play in any of the preseason games. But he's practicing and could be pretty much 100 percent when the season starts. Barry Sanders, Emmitt Smith, LaDainian Tomlinson. Those guys didn't play in preseason games as rookies and had value. Richardson is running behind an above-average offense line, and he'll be the guy they build their whole offense around. Give him a few weeks to settle in, but he could (probably should) be a top-10 back the final three months of the season. Those who select Richardson will want to handcuff him with **Montario Hardesty**. Richardson is just working his way back into practices; most likely he'll return in Week 2. ... The Browns cut **Evan Moore**. Cleveland was mulling making Moore a big part of their offense last year, but it's sticking with **Benjamin Watson**. Watson has had some concussion problems and sat out the entire preseason, so it looks unlikely he'll play all 16 games. The team is grooming **Jordan Cameron** for the starting job. In a dynasty league, Cameron should be selected before Watson (though neither has much value). ... The Browns cut **Seneca Wallace**. His NFL career is likely over.

DALLAS:

The Cowboys have injury issues with their receiving corps, but none seem to be too serious. They could be at pretty much full strength by Week 2. **Miles Austin** has been out since Aug. 4 with a hamstring injury; he says he'll definitely play in the opener against the Giants. **Dez Bryant** sat out the final two preseason games and has patellar tendinitis (jumper's knee); he should be fine for the first game. And **Jason Witten** has been out since mid-August with a lacerated spleen. Witten has been doing some work in practices, and he's expected to be in the starting lineup in Week 2 (he might even beat the odds and play in the opener – that will depend on a CT scan on Tuesday). All of these injuries work against **Tony Romo**. We'd be nervous about starting him in that first game. But on the flip side, he'll work against a Giants secondary in that game that also has a lot of injuries. And Dallas seems to have a little more depth at wide receiver than we previously thought. **Kevin Ogletree** (and to a lesser degree, **Dwayne Harris**) looked strong in the second and third preseason games. Dallas appears to have the hardest schedule in the league the first two weeks of the season – on the road against the Giants and Seahawks. The entire schedule, for that matter, is tough. After hosting Tampa Bay in Week 3 (no complaints there), Dallas is at home for a Monday nighter against Chicago. We'll call that game average. But coming out of a bye in Week 5, four of the next five are on the road against Baltimore, Carolina, Atlanta and Philadelphia. The one home game in that span is against the Giants.

DENVER:

Those hoping for an impact from third-rounder **Ronnie Hillman** will need to be patient. He missed the first two exhibitions with a hamstring injury before playing with reserves in the third and fourth. Hillman looked OK in the finale, busting off a couple of nice runs while running for 68 yards, but that was just reserves and a bunch of guys not even on teams now. He appears to be firmly behind **Willis McGahee**, **Lance Ball** and **Knowshon Moreno** for now. He'll need a couple of injuries to be any kind of factor as a rookie. Moreno entered the preseason with his roster spot in jeopardy, but drew praise from John Elway after a strong showing in the exhibition finale. He's a former first-round pick, so there's talent there. It's possible he climbs past Ball for the primary backup job to McGahee, who turns 31 in October. ... Those with an eye to getting a fast start can reasonably be concerned about Denver's early-season schedule. They play divisional foes Oakland and San Diego, but their other five opponents in the first

seven games are Pittsburgh, Atlanta, Houston, New England and New Orleans. All of those teams made the playoffs a year ago. The schedule gets easier after that, but a 2-5 start looks possible.

DETROIT:

Kevin Smith is the running back to own on this roster. He'll be a full-time player at the start of the year. Jahvid Best is beginning the season on the PUP list, and Mikel Leshoure is serving a two-game suspension. Smith should be out there on pretty much every down for the first two weeks of the season, then Leshoure will need time to carve out a role. Leshoure is more talented than Smith – bigger and faster – but he's raw as heck after missing his entire rookie season. Eventually, Leshoure and Smith will become a one-two punch, but right now Smith seems to be well ahead of him. He's been around for a few years and is much better in terms of receiving and pass protection. As often as the Lions pass (and with Matthew Stafford having had some injuries) they'll want to be careful how much they play Leshoure. Smith's preseason ended with an ankle injury, but it doesn't look like a big deal. He just rolled it; he didn't even need a walking boot. We're not giving up on Best. He looks like a sneaky good stash pick in a PPR format. He catches lots of passes. He led all running backs last year in receiving production per game (more than even Darren Sproles). Best is ready to play right now. Doctors have just been cautious with clearing him because he had multiple concussions at Cal and then more concussion issues last year. They want him to be a year removed from any concussions before putting him back out there. So when he comes off the PUP list following Week 6, it's possible he'll be a nice part of that passing game. Maybe he catches 40 passes in the second half of the season.

GREEN BAY:

Cedric Benson has looked pretty good running the football, but he's not a guy we're particularly interested in. He won't be a part of the passing game (only once has he caught more than 20 passes in a season), and probably won't get many carries near the goal line (Green Bay tends to use fullback **John Kuhn** at the goal line and doesn't run for many TDs anyway). And Benson fumbled 12 times his last two years in Cincinnati, then lost it again on his first carry in the final exhibition. We won't make too big a deal out of that, but it's another potential issue that could serve to limit Benson's snaps. In Benson's favor is that he has little competition. **James Starks** has been sidelined with a turf toe injury and didn't show much before getting hurt. **Alex Green**

should play on some passing downs, but he's looked pretty bad as a runner (2.1 yards per carry in the preseason), and he's coming off a torn ACL. Until Starks is healthy, Benson looks like a lock for the bulk of the rushing attempts. ... A couple of weeks back we expressed doubt that the Packers would enter the season with **Graham Harrell** backing up Aaron Rodgers. Green Bay apparently has confidence in Harrell, having not brought anyone else in, and Harrell looked pretty good in the final exhibition. His outing included a strong throw over the middle to Jermichael Finley and a 54-yard bomb to set up a touchdown. He finished 13 of 15 for 223 yards and 2 TDs. Things could change, but for now he's the guy who would take over this powerhouse offense if Rodgers gets hurt.

HOUSTON:

The Texans look like they might have the best special teams in the league. **Trindon Holliday** has been phenomenal in the preseason, scoring 3 TDs on kick returns. He looks like he might be better than even guys like Devin Hester and Patrick Peterson. He's tiny, but he's a decorated NCAA sprint champ. Holliday has shown potential in the past, but he's been derailed by injuries his first two years. He's healthy now, and it looks he'll probably score 2, 3, maybe even 4 TDs on kick returns. Our only concern is that he may have tipped his hand too much with his preseason outburst. Teams that play Houston may give Holliday the same respect that's shown to the likes of Hester and Peterson. Better to kick the ball out of bounds than give up a 70-yard punt return. Those in leagues giving points for return yardage are advised that teams averaged 1,385 yards last year on kickoff/punt returns. That's a sign Holliday has a very good chance to go for 1,500-1,600 yards as a returner. ... The Texans traded for Tyler Clutts on Friday. Not necessarily a huge deal, but this might help **Arian Foster**. Our No. 1 concern with Foster is blocking. The Texans have new starters at right guard and right tackle. Joel Dreessen signed with Denver and Lawrence Vickers is with Dallas. Including the tight end and fullback, that's about half of the group that will be trying to open the holes for Foster. Those guys need to be coached up and learn the scheme. They've got an unheralded youngster, Derek Newton, at the key right tackle spot. They're planning on starting James Casey at fullback. At 6-foot-3 and 243 pounds, he's not quite the body type you're looking for to handle the punishing lead-blocking duties of a traditional fullback. He's more of a pass-catching tight end or H-back. So Clutts looks like he might fit in at some point. At 260, he might provide a little more pop as a

blocker at that spot, if necessary. Good for Foster.

INDIANAPOLIS:

Coby Fleener had the Stanford connection with Andrew Luck, catching 34 passes for 667 yards and 10 TDs last season. But he didn't do much in the exhibitions; in the finale Luck threw 2 passes his way and he dropped one of them. He'll be the starting tight end, but it doesn't appear he'll be a big part of the passing game. Long-term, we find ourselves increasingly intrigued by the tight end Indianapolis drafted a round later, **Dwayne Allen**. Allen caught 50 passes at Clemson a year ago, and he's going to be on the field just as much as Fleener. He only caught 3 balls in the exhibitions (he also got a carry), so we're not guaranteeing he'll make much of an impact. But he might be a serviceable option, and he could turn into the more complete player down the road. ... We've all but taken **Austin Collie** (concussions) off our draft board. He's been cleared to do some work at practice, but after being sidelined for much of the preseason, we're not confident he can stay healthy. Next in line is **Donnie Avery**, the former Ram who started the final two preseason games. The Colts say Collie should play in Week 1, but he looks like a poor bet to stay there. Avery is worthy of a late-round pick for his upside potential. He carries some injury risk of his own, so eventually a rookie – **T.Y. Hilton** or **LaVon Brazill** – could end up playing a big role. Those rookies will also return kicks.

JACKSONVILLE:

Chris Johnson, Peyton Hillis and Matt Forte had the contract issues last year, and it affected their production. **Maurice Jones-Drew**, who finally reported on Sunday, might be in a similar boat. It's not certain he'll play in Week 1, and it might be another week or two before he's ready for a big workload. He didn't get a new contract, so it's possible he'll let that disappointment affect his on-field production. Will he run as hard? And if he has a sore ankle, will he be willing to play? The Jaguars haven't seemed too concerned. **Rashad Jennings** looks like a more than capable fill-in. Jennings is expected to start the first game, and he could have big role, particularly in September. Jennings ran for 209 yards on 47 attempts in the four practice games. With him having been around all summer, we expect he'll play a lot more than usual. Goal-line situations, for example, could be a spot where they use Jennings; he's 20 pounds heavier anyway. Against Atlanta in the final preseason game, Jennings banged out a first down on a fourth-and-one play, and he also moved the sticks on an important third-and-

one carry. Jones-Drew hasn't tended to be effective on those kind of plays. Inside the 5 last year, for example, he gained only 8 yards, with 4 TDs, on his 17 carries. ... The Jaguars paid **Laurent Robinson** big money in free agency, but it doesn't look like he and Blaine Gabbert have much of a rapport. Robinson caught only 2 of the 10 passes thrown his way in the preseason, for just 18 yards. That's not all his fault, of course. Gabbert missed him on a 61-yard touchdown in the last game. But our leaning is that Robinson is hardly worth even drafting in typical formats. Slot receiver **Mike Thomas** might catch more passes. **Justin Blackmon** looks like the clear No. 1 receiver. Ball skills; that's what separates the rookie. Like Cris Carter or Larry Fitzgerald, Blackmon seems to have a big catch radius, even when he's covered. ... **Blaine Gabbert** looks a lot more comfortable. He's completed 61 percent of his passes, with 3 TDs and no interceptions. Not great, but a clear notch better than last year. (In the 2011 preseason, he completed 50 percent and averaged a yard fewer per attempt, with 1 TD vs. 1 Int.) Gabbert won't run. That works against his fantasy value. But he's improved enough that in a 12-team league, some franchise should probably select him.

KANSAS CITY:

Two years ago Thomas Jones (245 carries) and **Jamaal Charles** (230) split the rushing attempts almost right down the middle. Different coaching staff, but it's clear that Kansas City plans a similar sort of division of labor between Charles and **Peyton Hillis**. Kansas City opened its final exhibition game with those backs and a pair of reserve runners carrying 9 straight times for 35 yards. That could be the approach in a lot of games, with Hillis handling the short-yardage carries and Charles making more big plays. In that split with Jones, Charles totaled nearly 2,000 yards (1,467 rushing, 468 receiving, with 8 TDs), so he shouldn't be underestimated. Coming off the torn ACL, limiting his carries might make him more likely to play a full season. Hillis averaged a healthy 5.7 yards per carry in the exhibitions and repeatedly showed the ability to move the pile and drag tacklers downfield. Both of these backs have considerable value; if our sense of Hillis' workload is correct, he should outperform where he's being selected in drafts. ... This should be a below-average passing game, in part by design, so our expectations are modest for **Matt Cassel** and **Dwayne Bowe**. Bowe is a big, talented guy, but there won't be a major effort made to get him the ball. He has value comparable to the other potential targets in the passing game, all of whom will be dividing up a very small pie, but that's about it. We'll give **Jon**

Baldwin the slight edge to have value at the No. 2 spot ahead of **Steve Breaston**; a year from now, Baldwin might emerge as the No. 1 (Bowe, playing on the franchise tag this season, might not be re-signed). If there's a sleeper here, it's **Dexter McCluster**. He's bounced back and forth from running back to wide receiver since being drafted two years ago, but is now being used exclusively as a slot receiver. He caught 13 passes for 129 yards and a touchdown in the exhibitions. Particularly in leagues awarding a point per reception, he might outperform all of the receivers (including tight ends Tony Moeaki and Kevin Boss) after Bowe. ... **Brady Quinn** suffered a neck injury in the exhibition finale; his status going forward is uncertain. He beat out Ricky Stanzi for the backup job and made the 53-man roster, but it's possible Stanzi will be the No. 2 early in the season.

MIAMI:

The Dolphins are our choice to finish with the worst offense in the league. They've got the worst receiving corps in the league, a below-average line, below-average running backs and an unusually raw rookie at quarterback. **Ryan Tannehill** started for only a season and a half at Texas A&M. Maybe eventually (2014?) they get him polished up and he develops into a viable quarterback. For this season, his fantasy value is as a guy who might serve up a bunch of turnovers and sacks for defenses. The Dolphins allowed 52 sacks last year (3rd-most in the league). Tannehill tossed 15 interceptions in 13 games last year in college. Adjusting to the higher speed of the pro game, something like 25 interceptions is possible. To his credit, Tannehill (while not particularly effective) didn't make a ton of mistakes in the preseason. He averaged only 5.3 yards per attempt, which is lousy, but in 82 pass plays, he was sacked only 4 times, with 1 interception and 1 fumble. But Houston definitely will have the No. 1 defense when our initial version of the Weekly comes out on Wednesday. The Raiders, Jets and Cardinals are next in line, potentially benefiting from this matchup. ... **Reggie Bush** looks like this team's best fantasy option. He'll be their featured runner and might catch 50 passes. He put up 1,382 total yards last year. But he won't score many touchdowns, and he's had problems staying healthy. **Daniel Thomas** held off Lamar Miller for the backup job. ... **Davone Bess** can work the middle of the field, but he's really like Danny Amendola or Mike Thomas – better suited to be in the slot on third downs. The Dolphins don't have much else at wide receiver. **Legedu Naanee**, **Brian Hartline**, maybe even **Marlon Moore** could start. They may bring in a receiver cut by another team who'll end up starting.

MINNESOTA:

Stay away from **Adrian Peterson**. Coming off reconstructive knee surgery, it's not realistic to expect him to make much of an impact. Peterson is working hard and coming along, but that's a serious injury and he plays the worst, most punishing position. This isn't a pocket passer like Tom Brady, standing and throwing the ball. Peterson relies on his speed and power. The Vikings will want to be cautious with their best player, and it may be another year (if ever) before No. 28 is back to being the league's marquee running back. Jerry Rice says the biggest mistake he made as a pro was coming back too quickly from knee surgery. Peterson didn't play at all in the preseason. He started taking some hits in practice last week, but above-the-waist only. Leslie Frazier says he's not even sure if Peterson will play in the opener. Peterson will practice this week, and they'll go from there. Sounds like **Toby Gerhart** (who's a starter-caliber back anyway) will be the main runner, with Peterson maybe getting a dozen touches. Gerhart might even go the distance. When mid-October rolls around, the Vikings might still be using Gerhart on all passing downs and short-yardage situations. Relative to where they're picked, Gerhart is the better fantasy option. ... **Jerome Simpson** might add a dimension to the offense. He's more talented than the receivers they used opposite Percy Harvin last year. But Simpson has been suspended by the league for the first three weeks of the season.

NEW ENGLAND:

Brandon Lloyd is the marquee addition to this offense, but we don't see him making a big impact. He and Tom Brady don't seem to have much of a rapport – not yet, anyway. Lloyd was the intended target on 4 passes in the preseason, and he caught only 1 of them (for 12 yards). Astute readers will point out that Randy Moss didn't catch any passes in the 2007 preseason, then went on to catch a record 23 touchdowns in the regular season. But we are nervous about Lloyd. He seems to be the No. 4 option in the passing game. He'll definitely catch fewer passes than Gronkowski, Hernandez and Welker. We expect they'll use him primarily as a deep threat, but there's no evidence he's going to thrive in that role. He's not particularly big or fast. The Patriots thought Chad Ochocinco could fill that kind of a role in their offense last year, and it didn't work out at all. Not that Lloyd will be a bust of that magnitude, but our feeling is to let somebody else in your league take on that gamble. ... **Stevan Ridley** looks like the clear starter at tailback. He should be solid. He's bigger and faster than BenJarvus Green-Ellis. Those who select Ridley will want to insure that pick in the later rounds by picking up **Shane Vereen**.

But Ridley looks like the guy, and as well as the Patriots move the ball, we're thinking he'll probably punch in about a dozen touchdowns. ... The Patriots have released **Deion Branch** and **Jabar Gaffney**, so it looks like **Julian Edelman** will be their No. 3 receiver. We don't envision Edelman catching many passes. Maybe he finishes with 300-400 yards. New England uses two tight ends essentially full time, so it doesn't use too many sets with three wide receivers. But if Welker (who's an older guy) gets hurt, Edelman would step in and be a viable fantasy option. The Patriots also traded for **Greg Salas** on Saturday. He played for offensive coordinator Josh McDaniels in St. Louis last year, so maybe McDaniels envisions Salas eventually developing into a No. 3 guy. Either way, barring injury, we don't expect either player to have a big role this season. ... The Patriots are going with **Ryan Mallett** as the backup behind Tom Brady. Mallett seems to have made decent progress. Brady is 35, and Mallett probably will be this team's next starting quarterback. ... The Patriots placed **Jeff Demps** on injured reserve. He'll probably be their kick returner in 2013.

NEW ORLEANS:

The Saints are going with **Garrett Hartley** at kicker. They cut John Kasay. Hartley looks like a candidate to be one of the top half-dozen scorers at the position. In the last three years, only three teams have scored more kicking points; since 2008, the New Orleans kickers have scored 119, 126, 118 and 147 points. Kasay has accuracy but lacks leg strength (he'll be 43 in October). With lots of other solid kickers looking for work, we think his career is over. ... New Orleans placed **Nick Toon** on injured reserve. If one of their top 3 receivers gets hurt, then **Joseph Morgan** likely would become a big part of their offense. You know all about **Marques Colston**, of course. **Lance Moore** and **Devery Henderson** could be undervalued in drafts. Moore tends to work the underneath stuff, but he's part of their red zone attack. He's caught 26 TDs, plus a couple of 2-point conversions, in his last 44 games. Henderson is more of a big-play option. In the six games that New Orleans was missing one its top 3 receivers last year, Henderson caught 20 passes for 426 yards and 3 TDs. ... The Saints kept both of their young running backs, **Chris Ivory** and **Travaris Cadet**. Neither projects to play much, but if there's an injury, they would become a viable part of the offense. Ivory is more like Mark Ingram; if Ingram were to get hurt, they would likely stick Ivory in that role. When Ingram missed the final six games last year, Ivory ran for 53, 74, 35, 127, 47 and 23 yards. The 127-yard game came in Week

17, when the other running backs were held out. Cadet is more like Pierre Thomas. If either Thomas or Darren Sproles gets hurt, then you'll likely see Cadet getting on the field a lot.

N.Y. GIANTS:

The Giants ranked last in rushing last year, down at only 89 yards per game. That will improve; we're think they'll move up to around 110-115. The averaged at least 115 rushing yards in each of the previous seven seasons. The offensive line should play better, and they look stronger at tailback. They've still got **Ahmad Bradshaw**; at 26, he's still in his prime. And **David Wilson** looks like he'll be a big upgrade over Brandon Jacobs. A 30-year-old power runner, Jacobs is right at the end of his career. Wilson brings a lot more speed and big-play ability to the table. He looks a lot like Bradshaw – a smaller back (5-9, 205) who packs surprising power. Wilson maybe doesn't run quite as hard as Bradshaw, but he's got more pure speed. He may break loose for a couple of touchdowns from 40-plus yards before the year is through. He had the breakout-type game against the Bears, with a 29-yard catch-and-run and 5 carries for 49 yards, and he followed it up with another solid effort against New England. Wilson finished with only 13 yards on 8 carries in that game, but you can see the potential. He's got the speed, power and vision; there just wasn't enough room for him in that game. We see Wilson as one of the best No. 2 running backs in the league. He'll get about 40 percent of the workload and run for maybe 700 yards, and he'll start cranking out big games if Bradshaw goes down with an injury. ... Wilson may contribute to the passing game declining. If the Giants have more success with the run, that probably means they won't have to pass as often. The team averaged 308 passing yards last year, but it was down at 265 and 250 the previous two years. That's a contributing factor to us slotting **Eli Manning** behind Matt Ryan. ... **Hakeem Nicks** missed most of the summer with a broken foot, but there's some risk there. He played in the final preseason game, but he's not fully healthy. He didn't practice on Sunday, for example, and supposedly there was some pain. Nicks says he'll definitely play in the first game. We can't promise he'll play in all 16. ... **Rueben Randle** doesn't look like he'll make much of an impact as a rookie. He's a big, talented prospect, but he doesn't seem to know the offense well enough yet. **Domenik Hixon** and **Ramses Barden** seem to be ahead of him in the pecking order. ... The Giants released **D.J. Ware**. That leaves **Andre Brown** and **Da'Rell Scott** as the third and fourth tailbacks; one of those guys

almost certainly will be elevated into a change-of-pace role at some point this year.

N.Y. JETS:

Dustin Keller left the third exhibition game with a hamstring injury, but apparently it was just a tweak; he's expected to be fine for the regular season. ... If you like to use a roster spot on nobody backup running backs who could emerge as starters, consider **Bilal Powell**. The 2011 fourth-rounder didn't exactly turn heads while averaging 3.5 yards per carry in the preseason, but he played well enough to beat out **Joe McKnight** for the third-down role, and he looks like he might be just as good as **Shonn Greene**. If Greene falters at some point, Powell would get his chance. He's more suited to play full-time than New York's other top ball carriers; more solidly built than McKnight, and a better receiver than Greene. The Jets cut sixth-rounder Terrance Ganaway. ... The Jets averaged just 8 points per game in their exhibition games. The three other teams that averaged under 9 points in the last 10 preseasons – 2006 Washington, 2007 Kansas City, 2010 Carolina – combined to go 11-37 in the regular season, and not one of them ranked higher than 20th in scoring. The Jets likely will add some Wildcat wrinkles with Tim Tebow once the real games start, but it looks unlikely this team will move the ball or score consistently. In the backfield and at receiver, it looks like a talent-thin group, and the quarterback play also figures to be subpar. Tough to get excited about selecting any of the team's players on draft day, and that includes a defense which might spend a lot of time playing from behind.

OAKLAND:

With **Denarius Moore** battling a hamstring injury for the entire preseason, we're slotting him behind two other Oakland wideouts, **Darrius Heyward-Bey** and undrafted rookie **Rod Streater**. The team has installed a new offense, and Moore hasn't done any work in it with Carson Palmer. Offensive coordinator Greg Knapp calls it a "huge setback" for Moore, and the way Streater has taken advantage of his opportunity, it's not certain he'll just be pushed aside once Moore is healthy. Moore is practicing now, so he should be available in Week 1, but perhaps he'll get limited reps as he works his way back. **Jacoby Ford** (foot) is also practicing, but we suspect he'll be clearly behind Streater in the pecking order. (Ford is on track to be the primary return man; Oakland cut insurance policy Roscoe Parrish.) When everyone is healthy, most likely the team will use a lot of three-receiver sets, with Heyward-Bey and Moore running deeper routes and Streater working the middle of

the field. Even as the No. 3, the rookie could lead the team in receptions. It also helps that Oakland doesn't have much in terms of pass catchers at tight end. The projected starter, Brandon Myers, caught 16 passes in 16 games (7 starts) last season. ... **Taiwan Jones** has won the backup job, and Darren McFadden's lengthy history of injuries suggests Jones will start at some point this year. The thinly built (6-0, 195) speedster will likely share work with **Mike Goodson**, however, so we're not particularly high on either runner. ... **Sebastian Janikowski** injured his groin in the third exhibition, but he's on track to kick in Week 1.

PHILADELPHIA:

Michael Vick suffered a rib cage injury in Philadelphia's second exhibition game and didn't play the rest of the preseason. He'll be out there in Week 1 wearing a Kevlar vest that supposedly will both protect him from further injury and also feel light – that is, not restrict him from running around outside the pocket. We'll see. Vick played two preseason games and was knocked out of both of them. We consider Vick a high-risk, high-upside pick. When he's on the field, he has the potential to be a top-5 quarterback, but he might not run as effectively or as often as in the past, and he can't stay healthy. If you draft him, make sure you're comfortable with your backup. ... For the Eagles, that backup will be rookie **Nick Foles**. The Eagles cut Mike Kafka, who looked solid last preseason but got hurt this year. ... The Eagles kept two rookie running backs, **Bryce Brown** and **Chris Polk**. At some point (perhaps next summer) one of those guys could move past **Dion Lewis** is the pecking order at tailback. Lewis knows the offense better, but they have better measurables. ... The Eagles released sixth-round wideout **Marvin McNutt**, suggesting they expect **Riley Cooper** back from injury relatively early in the season. The only other wideout behind the top three is impressive rookie **Damaris Johnson**. Starters DeSean Jackson and Jeremy Maclin have injury histories, so one of the reserves will probably start some games this season. Jason Avant will be the slot receiver.

PITTSBURGH:

It's a four-man backfield in Pittsburgh. **Rashard Mendenhall** is the big name, but we're not counting on him doing much this year. He's coming off reconstructive knee surgery and might not be ready to play until October. When he plays, it probably will be only as part of a committee. Do not draft him. A few weeks back, the sexy pick as a replacement was **Isaac Redman**, but his value is dropping. He's banged up with various injuries (hip, groin, ankle) and

indicates he might not be 100 percent all year. Redman might not be their best back anyway. **Jonathan Dwyer** was a washout as a rookie but looks a lot more confident and knowledgeable. He's certainly a lot more effective. He averaged 5.3 yards per carry in the preseason games, consistently running guys over. He runs angry. We expect Redman and Dwyer will share time at the start of the season, and Dwyer probably will take this job away. He just looks better than Redman (who averaged only 2.2 per attempt in the preseason). The fourth guy is rookie **Chris Rainey**. He seems to be inheriting the Mewelde Moore role. He'll play on third downs, catch a few balls and maybe bust a few long gainers. In the practice games, he scored on a 41-yard run and a 57-yard pass. His bigger impact should be as a kick returner. He had 2 TDs on punt returns nullified in the Carolina game. He'll be a big-time player in leagues giving credit for individual return yards. He'll return both kickoffs and punts, and NFL teams averaged 1,385 yards on kick returns last year. With his run-rec production, he'll probably get up around 1,800 yards and maybe 5 TDs. ... **Mike Wallace** joined the team just last week. That should affect his production early in the year. He might not be in ideal condition, and they put in a new offensive system. We will be surprised if **Antonio Brown** doesn't outperform Wallace. They've also got **Emmanuel Sanders**, who looks like one of the best No. 3 receivers around.

ST. LOUIS:

We find ourselves getting a lot more interested in **Danny Amendola**. He looks like the No. 1 receiver, and the passing offense will be better this year. Amendola can work the middle of the field; there's some Wes Welker in his game. Amendola caught 83 passes two years ago, and he's healthy again now. It also looks like there should be an uptick coming in terms of scoring. In his first three years, Amendola scored on only 4 of 133 receptions. But he caught 2 TDs in the preseason. He makes a lot of sense in the later rounds, particularly in a PPR format. ... If there's a second quality wide receiver, it probably will be **Steve Smith**. He seems to be healthy again, and he started all of the preseason games. He had a nice diving 46-yard catch on Thursday. Heck, maybe he'll be just as good as Amendola. But he doesn't have that proven rapport with the quarterback, and the Rams have plenty of other guys. **Brandon Gibson** was out there with the first-unit offense a lot in the final two exhibitions. Maybe one of the youngsters will come on. **Austin Pettis** is a possibility, but he's suspended for the first four games of the season. **Brian Quick** was the first pick of the second round, but we

don't think he'll do anything this year; he didn't seem to get on the field with the first-unit offense at all in the preseason. ... We're not sure who's the No. 2 tailback. When the Rams selected **Isaiah Pead** in the second round, it was with the intention that he would be that guy. But seventh-rounder **Daryl Richardson** was more impressive in the preseason. In the final game, Richardson came in and played with the first-unit before Pead did. They posted similar stats in the first half. If Steven Jackson gets hurt, our expectation is that these backs will share time, with the more productive back gradually securing the job. The wild card in the formula is **Terrance Ganaway**; the Jets cut him, but maybe Ganaway will fit this offense better. Two months from now, Ganaway could be challenging for the No. 2 role. ... We're not sure what to make of **Sam Bradford**. He looked like a possible breakout quarterback in the wins against Kansas City and Baltimore, completing 17 of 25 passes, with 5 TDs and no interceptions. But he couldn't move the ball at all in the showcase third exhibition at Dallas, completing only 6 of 17 for 64 yards. ... In a straight-up swap of washout right tackles, the Rams sent Jason Smith to the Jets in exchange for Wayne Hunter. This isn't a big deal. Both teams are hoping, apparently, that a change of scenario can help get a former starter back on track. But there's a pretty chance that neither will start any games for their new teams. The Rams should have one of the league's five worst offensive lines.

SAN DIEGO:

Robert Meachem was the big offseason signing, but he didn't do anything in the preseason to suggest he's ready to step in and do a Vincent Jackson impersonation. He and Philip Rivers haven't seemed to be on the same page. Our expectation, therefore, is that **Malcom Floyd**, not Meachem, will be this team's best wide receiver. Floyd's numbers the last two years (when adjusted to per game stats) have been virtually identical to Jackson's. As luck would have it, the first game is at Oakland, where Floyd has played well two years in a row, including a career-best game with over 200 yards. ... The Chargers are comfortable with **LeRon McClain** at fullback. McClain could be a Mike Tolbert kind of guy for them, maybe running for 400 yards, catching 40-50 passes and handling a good chunk of the goal-line work. He's a good short-yardage runner. We would feel better about predicting McClain would get those 1-yard touchdowns if the Chargers hadn't released Jacob Hester. Hester blocked for Tolbert on those plays last year. With Tolbert gone, the Chargers might need McClain to play fullback in those situations. **Ryan Mathews** has the

broken collarbone and should miss the first few games. Hard to believe they'd risk Mathews in those kind of situations this year. He's not a good short-yardage runner anyway. The other possible option is **Ronnie Brown**. Brown will start the first 3ish games while Mathews mends. All three of these backs might score 3-6 TDs. Working against all of them is the team's offensive line. It's a lot softer than it's been in the past, which could hurt the entire offense.

SAN FRANCISCO:

Everyone is waiting to see how the Jets use Tim Tebow. Do they stick him out there for a couple of series per game? Do they bring him in when they're inside the 10? He is the X-factor on the roster. But the 49ers have a Tebow-type quarterback of their own: **Colin Kaepernick**. He's got the same kind of size and running ability. He's one of three current quarterbacks who ran for 20 TDs in a college season – Kaepernick, Tebow and Cam Newton. And the 49ers look like they might use him as changeup pitch in their own offense. Unlike the Jets, they haven't talked about it. But in one preseason game, the 49ers brought Kaepernick in for the second quarter and immediately went to a Wildcat, read-option type offense. Kaepernick quickly ripped off a 78-yard touchdown. In LaMichael James, they have a speedy running back who played in the same kind of offense at Oregon. James is a better fit for this kind of offense than anybody who's playing with Tebow. The 49ers worked in this look again in their next exhibition. It looks like something they'll use at least a little in the regular season. They don't have much of a passing offense, and they don't want Alex Smith trying to do too much. ... The 49ers are overloaded with wide receivers. **Michael Crabtree**, **Randy Moss**, **Mario Manningham**, **Kyle Williams** and **Ted Ginn, Jr.** It looks like they're all going to rotate in and play. And the 49ers will have a bottom-10 passing game, making us confident that none of them will put up good numbers. Tight end **Vernon Davis** should be this team's most productive pass catcher anyway.

SEATTLE:

The Seahawks released **Kellen Winslow**. No surprise there. It was more of a surprise when they traded for him. He's an older tight end with bad knees and limited blocking ability. The move, however, does increase out interest in **Zach Miller**. He's the clear tight end here, and Seattle is on the upswing. Seattle picked up **Evan Moore** (the former Brown), but he's more of a developmental guy. ... **Marshawn Lynch** has been sitting out with back spasms. It's not necessarily a big deal – Pete Carroll says Lynch is going to be fine – but it's something

to keep in mind as the season approaches. Lynch missed a game at Cleveland last season due to a back injury. Rookie **Robert Turbin** won the backup job, and he's a powerful, bruising back like Lynch. He could spell Lynch some during games, and would be in line to start if Lynch is sidelined. Those who select Lynch will want to make it a priority to secure his backup in the latter stages of fantasy drafts. ... We are warming to the idea of the Seahawks being one of the NFL's sleeper teams, a legitimate contender to be one of the NFC's six playoff squads. They might have landed the steal of the draft in third-round quarterback **Russell Wilson**, who clearly beat out free-agent **Matt Flynn** for the starting job. Their draft included two other rookies who should be big contributors to their defense: first-round pass rusher Bruce Irvin, and second-rounder Bobby Wagner, who beat out veteran Barrett Ruud for their middle linebacker job. Last but not least, the Seahawks ripped through the preseason, going undefeated and outscoring their opponents by more than 10 points per game. That might not seem like a big deal – these games don't count, after all – but of the last 19 teams that have managed that feat, only four have finished with losing records. Seattle won't be the favorite in the NFC West, but they'll give the 49ers and the various wild-card hopefuls a challenge. They've got some solid fantasy sleepers, too, notably Wilson and the **Seattle Defense**. ... **Sidney Rice** is ready to go for the regular season, after playing each of the final two exhibitions with no setbacks to his surgically repaired shoulders. We don't think he'll be a true go-to guy in the offense – the team has other talented players and might rotate them on and off the field – but he should be the No. 1. **Golden Tate** was the other starter in the exhibitions, but other wideouts (**Braylon Edwards**, **Doug Baldwin**) will also play. Tate has less-than-ideal size but made two highlight-reel quality non-catches in the preseason – great leaping catches in traffic without getting both feet down.

TAMPA BAY:

Doug Martin officially moved ahead of **LeGarrette Blount** on the depth chart last week, not that there had been much doubt. Greg Schiano thinks that even Blount, "when he watches the tape, he sees that he got outperformed." Schiano adds that Martin will have to work to keep the job, but realistically it will take a major faceplant for the rookie to slip behind the veteran. Blount probably will get only 20-30 percent of the carries; he definitely won't play in passing situations. He looks like a Martin handcuff, period. One more note on Martin's value. The Bucs last year allowed 31 points per game, nearly three points more than any other team.

Some of that is due to the team seeming to mail things in down the stretch, but it was also a talent-thin defense whose 23 sacks were 5 fewer than any other team. That isn't going to get fixed overnight, so the Bucs should again sport one of the league's sorriest defenses. Schiano will try to emphasize the running game, controlling the clock and keeping his own defense off the field. In games where that doesn't work, they'll probably spend a lot of time passing the ball in catch-up mode. Martin, as the team's primary runner and best receiving back (he caught 56 passes for 593 yards and 4 TDs his last two years at Boise State), should get plenty of work regardless. The Bucs signed former Giant **D.J. Ware** to perhaps take some of the passing down work, but we don't believe he'll have a major role. ... A year ago at this time **Josh Freeman** looked like one of the league's up-and-coming young quarterbacks. Today it's his strong 2010 season (25 TDs, 6 interceptions) that seems like the aberration. Last year he threw 16 TDs and 22 interceptions, a ratio in line with his rookie season (10 TDs, 18 interceptions). In the preseason he completed just 53 percent of his passes and averaged a woeful 4.8 yards per attempt. So not only is his completion percentage poor, but that's happening while he's mostly throwing shorter passes. We're not sure Freeman can turn things around, and that's part of why we're fairly low on his starting wideouts, **Vincent Jackson** and **Mike Williams**. This is a team that probably won't be looking to pass the ball very often, won't throw downfield much when it does, and might not be very good at it regardless. It's a bad combination for fantasy value. ... Kicker **Kai Forbath** was released, but he's starter material. He was perfect on field goals in the preseason, including a 55-yarder. There's a good chance he'll land with a team before the end of the year. He's better, for example, than Shaun Suisham of the Steelers.

TENNESSEE:

The league is suspending **Kenny Britt** for one game, but that's not a big deal. Britt wasn't going to start the opener anyway. It's his knees that are the concern. He underwent reconstructive knee surgery 11 months ago, and he's had followup procedures on both knees. Does he have the same speed and confidence? The Titans have other good receivers, so they could bring him along slowly or go with kind of a rotation. **Nate Washington** and **Kendall Wright** both will be heavily involved. They've also got **Jared Cook**, who's kind of an Aaron Hernandez-type player – more wide receiver than tight end. If he's healthy and dialed in, Britt should be better than those guys, but

it's a crowded situation. Also note that the Titans are going with youngster Jake Locker at quarterback, so a big decrease in passing production looks likely. The team ranked in the top 12 last year in both passing yards (257 yards per game) and touchdowns (22). There probably will be something like a 10 percent decline with Locker starting.

WASHINGTON:

With Washington holding many of its certain starters – Robert Griffin III, Pierre Garcon, Fred Davis – out of its final preseason game, we can draw some reasonable conclusions about less-certain aspects of the depth chart. **Alfred Morris** didn't play, while **Evan Royster** and **Roy Helu** did, suggesting Morris is on track to draw the start in Week 1. Both Royster and Helu missed the previous exhibition (Helu missed two), so their presence gave them a chance to prove their health and make a case for snaps. We're thinking Morris won the job with a 100-yard performance while running with the starters the previous week. The worry (and the reason we aren't ranking Morris higher) is that the other backs seem to be comparable in ability. Royster (10 carries, 44 yards and a TD) is nothing special, but most accounts had him the favorite to start prior to being sidelined with knee soreness; like Morris, he's a capable inside runner with the one-cut ability the offense requires. Helu isn't as rugged as those guys, but has more speed and is a better receiver. He carried 15 times for 90 yards and 2 TDs against Tampa Bay. We suspect Helu is ticketed for a third-down role, but could see an expanded workload or even start if Morris disappoints. Morris, Royster, Helu. They might all get shots at the featured role this year. Mike Shanahan isn't shy about switching out tailbacks when the running game isn't producing. Other backs are also possibilities. Washington may resign Tim Hightower at some point, and Steve Slaton is out there; he had a big season for Kyle Shanahan in Houston. Mike Shanahan says he's decided on a starter for the first game (probably Morris) but isn't saying who it is. ... **Leonard Hankerson** ran with the starters for most of the preseason. It appears he's beaten out **Josh Morgan**. But **Pierre Garcon** looks like the clear No. 1 receiver, and **Santana Moss** might be more productive than Hankerson. Moss will play in the slot and looked pretty good in the preseason. ... Washington cut Graham Gano in favor of former Raven **Billy Cundiff**. They might be having second thoughts after Cundiff badly missed on a 46-yard try last week. He converted his other three attempts, one of which came from 39 yards, but the other two were chip shots. We're not confident he'll retain the job all season.

FANTASY INDEX INDIVIDUAL DEFENSIVE PLAYER ANALYSIS

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DEFENSIVE LINE: Rams rookie first-rounder **Michael Brockers** suffered a high-ankle sprain in the exhibition finale. The tackle had a strong preseason, so it's a major negative for the Rams defense. St. Louis will try to fill the void with a couple of deep reserves, since **Darell Scott** is also hurt. ... Quiet preseason for rookie pass rusher **Bruce Irvin**, but Seattle coach Pete Carroll is talking him up anyway. "Bruce was the most productive guy in practice throughout the camp," he said. Carroll's positivism is legendary, so you can take his words with a grain of salt. Irvin can't be counted on for an impact early in the season, but he's worth stashing away in sack-driven scoring system. ... The Giants won't have tackle **Chris Canty** (knee) early in the season after he was placed on the PUP list. They weren't counting on him being healthy, but considering they also won't have **Marvin Austin** (back) for at least the first week, injuries are mounting. The starters will be **Linval Joseph** and probably **Rocky Bernard** to open the season. ... Eagles end **Jason Babin** (calf) is expected to be ready for Week 1. He and **Trent Cole** are both elite options.

LINEBACKERS: The Denver coaching staff is talking up **Von Miller**, believing he'll emerge as a dominant player in his second season. His pass rush ability is obvious after he recorded 11.5 sacks last year, but the team believe his tackle numbers will also increase. We're buying into the hype and moving him up our rankings. ... **Terrell Suggs** (Achilles) is on the PUP list and will definitely miss the first six games. The fact that Ravens kept him off injured reserve suggests they agree with his belief that he'll be able to play at some point during the season. Come midseason, if reports indicate he is close to returning, he's worth picking up in deeper IDP leagues. ... Things looked good for Browns rookie **James-Michael Johnson** when Chris Gocong was knocked out for the season; Gocong figured to open as a starter. But he now has an oblique injury of his own and will be sidelined for up to a month. He's

just a flier for those with deep rosters until he gets healthy. ... Don't draft Broncos linebacker **D.J. Williams**. He had 90 tackles last year, but he's out the first six games due to a league suspension, and could miss additional games due to a DUI offense. **Wesley Woodyard**, who led the team in tackles last year, is the linebacker to own along in tackle-heavy scoring systems. ... Pittsburgh third-rounder **Sean Spence** is done for the season with a knee injury. He was being counted on as a key reserve and possible starter next season. It's a long road back after he tore two ligaments last week.

DEFENSIVE BACKS: The Giants placed cornerback **Terrell Thomas** on injured reserve. It's not a huge surprise after he aggravated his reconstructed knee in the preseason. New York will move ahead with **Corey Webster** and **Prince Amukamara**, although Amukamara will also miss a couple of games due to a high-ankle sprain. There's nice upside with the second-year corner, though, if you have the roster room. ... Green Bay is going with **Jarrett Bush** as a starting cornerback across from **Tramon Williams**, with **Charles Woodson** at strong safety. For as long as Bush keeps the job (we're not confident it will be the entire season), he should see a lot of passes his way, as he's definitely the weak spot in the secondary. Woodson is the defensive back to own; he'll play cornerback in some situations. ... Romeo Crennel says he's hopeful cornerback **Brandon Flowers** will be able to return from a foot injury for Week 1. Those who drafted Flowers may want to come up with an alternate for that week, as Flowers can't be counted on unless he's out there practicing fully this week. **Javier Arenas** would likely fill in.
