- b) Industrial development - Our offices have during this six month period counselled numerous U.S. Corporations wishing to expand production facilities in the Province of Ontario to serve the Canadian market and other world markets. This consists mainly of supplying all the necessary data required for analysis and feasibility studies.
- c) Marketing - Our offices were engaged in the promotion and sale of Ontario made products in U.S. Market areas. Many Ontario based companies were assisted in making contact with U.S. buyers, manufacturers' representatives, agents and distributors.
