



Embassy of the Government of Pakistan

We have represented the Government of Pakistan in a variety of matters requiring legal advice in areas of civil and international law, such as customs matters, real estate matters, defense supply matters, and diplomatic immunity matters. We have represented the Government of Pakistan in its efforts to resolve its dispute with the United States over disposition of F-16 aircraft paid for but not received by the Government of Pakistan. We have assisted the Pakistan Embassy with comments and advice regarding the contents of correspondence with U.S. Government officials on these various matters.

Republic of the Philippines

We have advised the principal concerning the attraction and facilitation of U.S. investment. Such services included analysis of U.S. corporations potentially interested in the Philippine market and meetings with Philippine officials and both Philippine and U.S. business leaders, with the aim of facilitating U.S. investment in the Philippines, obtaining lists of potential investors, and discussing possible investment opportunities in the Philippines with various persons. We also have assisted the principal concerning Visiting Forces negotiations, civil aviation matters and, more generally, concerning U.S. - Philippine relations.

The Government of the State of Qatar

We advised the Government of the State of Qatar with respect to its bilateral relationship with the United States Government, the Middle East peace process, security and commercial issues. We provided advice in connection with official visits to the United States by Qatari officials; economic development initiatives in Qatar; initiatives to establish an American University in Qatar; and issues relative to defense cooperation between the United States and Qatar. We also provided comments and advice regarding the content of speeches/remarks and other communications by Qatari Government officials, and their correspondence with U.S. Government officials.

We also provide legal advice to the Government of the State of Qatar in matters involving international law, commercial investment, litigation, and contracts.

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ATTACHMENT B: Section III. No. 11

The Government of the Republic of Turkey

Consistent with the firm's commitment to facilitating the achievement of the common public policy goals of the Republic of Turkey and the United States, we are advising generally the Office of the Prime Minister of the Republic of Turkey and the Turkish Embassy in Washington with respect to: Turkey's long-standing bilateral relationship with the United States, human rights issues, direct foreign investment issues, energy strategies, security issues, and trade issues.

We assisted specifically the Office of the Prime Minister and the Turkish Embassy in evaluating several direct foreign investment projects in Turkey, in organizing and leading an investment mission to Turkey in November, in assessing the current state of U.S.-Turkey trade issues generally, in establishing and maintaining Turkish Studies Programs at American universities, in enhancing generally Turkey's Congressional relationships, in monitoring human rights and terrorism developments generally, in drafting and disseminating a "white paper" on the human rights situation in Turkey; in monitoring Congressional developments on issues of concern to Turkey, in refining energy and pipelines strategies, in coordinating public relations in the United States, and in examining security issues.
