

ATTACHMENT C, Section III, # 11

The Royal Embassy of Saudi Arabia

Pursuant to our agreement with Qorvis Communications, we have provided services to the Royal Embassy of Saudi Arabia regarding the Embassy's relationship with the U.S. Congress. Our activities have consisted of scheduling meetings with Members of Congress and Congressional staffers, attending these meetings, or accompanying an Embassy representative to meetings, and providing comments and advice regarding the content of congressional communications. We advised the Embassy on the status of legislation and legislative inquiries of interest to the Royal Kingdom, on the status of congressional hearings of interest, strategies for dealing with Congress and U.S. government officials, and strategies for improving the U.S.-Saudi bilateral relationship.

Corporate Fund Kazakhstan

We advised CFK with respect to its relationship with the U.S. Government. This included comments and advice on communications between the Republic of Kazakhstan and members of Congress, congressional staff, and certain Executive Branch officials. Our principal activity during this period included advising CFK and the Embassy of the status of legislation, strategies for addressing those measures, strategies for dealing with Congress and U.S. government officials, and strategies for improving the U.S.-Kazakhstan relationship.

Ministry of Foreign Affairs Czech Republic, Embassy

No activities were performed on behalf of this foreign principal.

Government of the Republic of Cameroon

We advised the Republic of Cameroon with respect to its relationship with the U.S. Congress and the Executive Branch Departments and Agencies. We met with Members of Congress, Congressional staff and Executive Branch officials to discuss several bilateral and multilateral issues of importance to Cameroon, including the Bakassi Peninsula. In addition, we facilitated meetings with such officials for representatives of the Cameroonian government to assist the government in advancing its public policy objectives.

Sociedade Nacional de Combustiveis de Angola / Republic of Angola (SONANGOL)

Representation of certain interests of Sociedade Nacional de Combustiveis de Angola (SONANGOL) in the United States and, on behalf of Sonangol, advice and assistance to the Government of Angola on defined public policy issues. Meetings with representatives of the United States government and international financial institutions to assist the client on issues involving transparency, human rights, trade and investment in Angola and bilateral relations with the United States.

ATTACHMENT C, Section III, # 11

Republic of Bulgaria

We advised the Republic of Bulgaria in its efforts to recover debt owed to it by Iraq. In addition, we advised the government on certain bilateral issues of importance between Bulgaria and the U.S. This entailed, in part, advising the government on its relationship with the U.S. Congress and the Executive Branch Departments and Agencies. We met with Members of Congress, Congressional staff and Executive Branch officials to help Bulgaria build support for its policy objectives.

Embassy of the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela

No activities were performed on behalf of this foreign principal.

The United Arab Emirates

We advised representatives of the Central Bank of the UAE regarding Free Trade Agreement negotiations with the United States, in particular with respect to the chapter dealing with financial services. This included a legal analysis of proposed text and suggestions for alternative language.

Embassy of the State of Kuwait

We communicated primarily with individuals at the Office of the United States Trade Representative concerning bilateral relations with the United States regarding the signing of a possible Free Trade Agreement between the two countries.

The Government of the State of Qatar.

We advised the Government of the State of Qatar with respect to its bilateral relationship with the United States Government, including security and commercial issues. We provided advice in connection with official visits to the United States by Qatari officials, economic development initiatives in Qatar; initiatives to establish relationships with American universities; human rights issues; and issues relative to defense cooperation between the United States and Qatar. We also provided comments and advice regarding the content of speeches/remarks and other communications by Qatar officials, and their correspondence with the U.S. Government officials. We also provide legal advice to the Government of Qatar in matters involving international law, commercial investment, litigation and contracts.

The Government of Trinidad & Tobago

We were part of a team led by Ainsley Gill & Associates advising the Government of Trinidad & Tobago with respect to its relationship with the U.S. Government regarding trade, energy and security issues. This has included: background work with the Administration on a potential trip by senior Administration officials to the region and contact of Congressional staff, including Committee staff, regarding these issues.
