OEHEG and OEMOLK, Austria - In December, 1978, I traveled to Vienna, Austria to meet with officials of OEHEG and OEMOLK and members of the Ministry of Agriculture of Austria. The purpose of my trip was to take part in a final meeting with representatives of the Department of Treasury concerning a pending countervailing duty case pertaining to Austrian cheese exported to the U.S. In April, 1979, the Treasury Department published a Notice that this case was discontinued for the reason that Austria no longer subsidizes cheese to the U.S. This was the full extent of my activities concerning OEHEG and OEMOLK. Other than meeting with Treasury officials, I met with no other parties within the U.S. Government.





Legislation was introduced in both House and Senate. We served as a source of information on the issue and related this information to the Congress.

Maintained contact with groups interested in the passage of this legislation such as various farmer groups and the railroads giving them information on the legislation and urging them to support it.

Maintained contact with our client in Mexico and the Embassy in Washington, D.C. about the status of the legislation.

As of the end of the reporting period, no hearings had been held in either House on the legislation.

C.N.I.E.L., France - Activities for the period ending April 30, 1979, consisted exclusively of keeping C.N.I.E.L. informed of the dairy situation, in particular with regard to imported dairy products, in the United States. We sent C.N.I.E.L. a number of memorandums during this period, which, on occasion, enclosed Department of Agriculture publications or materials published in trade newspapers concerning imported dairy products. Also, on numerous occasions, transmitted to C.N.I.E.L. various Federal Register notices concerning imported dairy products which were published by the U.S. Department of Agriculture or the Food and Drug Administration. During the period ending April 30, 1979, activities did not, on any occasion, include activities such as visits to Congressional offices on behalf of C.N.I.E.L. because there was no pending legislation directly affecting French imported dairy products. We did not participate in any Congressional hearings, or other governmental hearings of any nature on behalf of C.N.I.E.L.

Danish Cake & Biscuit Alliance (Danish Fancy Food Group, Ltd.), Denmark - Activities continued until the end of March, 1979 which consisted solely of keeping client advised of Geneva Trade Talk developments.
