



SCHEDULE "A"

The foreign principal on whose behalf the Registrant functions in the United States is World Zionist Organization (W.Z.O.) whose main office is located in Jerusalem.

The general objectives of W.Z.O. are:

To foster the ideals of Zionism and Judaism, and the unity of the Jewish people, to encourage the immigration of Jews to Israel and their resettlement and rehabilitation therein in industry, agriculture, commerce and the trades; and to assist and further their cultural, educational, religious, social, artistic and scientific endeavors.

To encourage, foster and promote the knowledge and study of Hebrew language and literature, Jewish culture, history, philosophy and traditions, and the achievement of the Zionist ideal; and in connection therewith, to disseminate, publish and otherwise make available cultural, literary, religious, social, artistic, scientific and other publications and works relating to Judaism, Zionism, Israel and kindred subjects.

Generally, the purpose of the Registrant's activities is to gain the increasing and continuing support of the American Jewish community for the above-mentioned objectives. However, the specific activities of the Registrant are primarily educational, cultural and religious and are carried out by its various departments, as more fully set forth in schedule "B" attached hereto.

TORAH EDUCATION AND CULTURE DEPARTMENT
JANUARY 1, 1993 THROUGH June 30, 1993

The months of January-June, 1993 were a time of continuation of the initiatives for the Torah Education and Culture Department in North America, whose activities during this period were concentrated in the following areas:

Dealing with Teacher-Shlichim

During the past year we maintained, in the United States and Canada:

101 teacher-shlichim who taught in 34 schools in 16 cities across the continent.

In-Service Programs, Seminars, and Teacher-Educator Convocations

In the 5753 school year (January 1 - June 30, 1993, we held 81 in-service programs in schools; participated in 9 regional in-service programs which were organized, generally, by BJE's or jointly by the department and a BJE; we held: 7 professional seminars for consultation in specific areas and disciplines: 4 for early-childhood education, 2 in modern Jewish history, and 1 in supplementary education.

Curriculum Development and Instructional Materials

In the past half-year, we placed our emphasis on the following developments (a partial listing only):

1. Teaching Israel
2. D'vash veHalav-A Development Approach to Jewish Culture and Hebrew Language Learning in Early Childhood education
3. Preparatory curricular planning for September, 1993 on Spanish-Jewish history by Dr. Sokolow, in cooperation with the Ben Zvi Institute in Jerusalem.

4. Workshops in teaching TALMUD, conducted by Rabbi Rothenberg, in cooperation with other rabbis and educators
5. Workshops, also by Rabbi Rothenberg, on teaching customs and ceremonies

In addition to these curricular programs, the department, for the summer of 1993, will send 9 groups of teachers to short-term programs in Israel. All told, 222 teachers and educators will have participated in Torah Department programs and seminars as follows:
