



SCHEDULE "A"

The foreign principal on whose behalf the Registrant functions in the United States is World Zionist Organization (W.Z.O.) whose main office is located in Jerusalem.

The general objectives of W.Z.O. are:

To foster the ideals of Zionism and Judaism, and the unity of the Jewish people, to encourage the immigration of Jews to Israel and their resettlement and rehabilitation therein in industry, agriculture, commerce and the trades; and to assist and further their cultural, educational, religious, social, artistic and scientific endeavors.

To encourage, foster and promote the knowledge and study of Hebrew language and literature, Jewish culture, history, philosophy and traditions, and the achievement of the Zionist ideal; and in connection therewith, to disseminate, publish and otherwise make available cultural, literary, religious, social, artistic, scientific and other publications and works relating to Judaism, Zionism, Israel and kindred subjects.

Generally, the purpose of the Registrant's activities is to gain the increasing and continuing support of the American Jewish community for the above-mentioned objectives. However, the specific activities of the Registrant are primarily educational, cultural and religious and are carried out by its various departments, as more fully set forth in schedule "B" attached hereto.

DEPARTMENT OF JEWISH EDUCATION AND CULTURE

Hebrew Language Instruction

1. Planning and preparing the curriculum of teaching Hebrew for summer camps as well as workshops for facilitators and summer camp directors.

10. Implementation of the Teacher-Ambassador program in Jewish schools and increasing the number of Shlichim teachers coming from Israel to teach in schools in the United States.
11. Planning and organizing a study curriculum for educators who want to prepare a trip to Israel.
12. Development and distribution of a preparatory program for groups going to Israel. This program will be implemented in schools that are planning student tours to Israel.
13. Strengthening contacts and developing educational projects with the reform and conservative movements as well as various youth movements.

Groups to Israel

1. Educational preparations for educational tours of students from 7 schools in the United States.
2. Sending 15 groups of teachers and students on educational tours in Israel.

Teachers development

Special workshops dealing with curriculum building were run by visiting experts from Israel. These were given to groups of teachers in several cities on the East and west coast.

Teachers in Volunteers services to Israel

Continuing the existing program and increasing the number of participants.

July 1, 1999 – December 30, 1999

During this period of time, the Department's activities covered the following areas:

1. Curriculum implementation

The department's focus during this period of time was on implementing curriculum marking the ingathering of the Jewish people from different countries and continuing to mark the 50th anniversary of the establishment of the state of Israel. Department personnel visited schools and institutions assisting and arranging special programs.

2. School services

The Department's representatives in the United States, along with specialists visiting from Israel, continued to make on-site visits to Metrowest, NJ; Los Angeles, CA ; New York, NY; Miami, FL; Chicago, IL; Phoenix ; AZ, Cleveland, OH, New Haven CT

3. Professional Conferences

Department personnel were present at the annual retreat of the principals Conference of CAJE.

4. Publications

The Department continued its participation in the publication of TEN DA'AT: A journal of Jewish Education. Several booklets were published containing curriculum and data on a variety of topics.

5. Israel Programs

Recruitment and enrollment for high school graduates in Israeli seminaries and educational institutions continued, as in previous years. With the redefinition of W.Z.O. and the Jewish Agency, attempts are underway to insure continuity in this area. A new pilot program was initiated for the winter break, which was very successful.
