This Office was never engaged with any travel trade show, receptions or special events sponsored, neither any familiarization tours.



## MAIN RAILROAD CONNECTIONS IN SPAIN

R.E.N.F.E. is an abbreviation for "Red Nacional de los Ferrocarriles Espanoles" or Spanish National Railways. The Spanish railroads are nationalized and operated by the Government. Following is a brief description of the different types of trains:

**TALGO:** An ultramodern train, fully air conditioned, operating between Madrid-Irun, Madrid-Zaragoza-Barcelona, Madrid-Valencia-Barcelona, Madrid-Malaga, Madrid-Sevilla-Cadiz.

**ELECTROTREN:** Very fast and modern trains electrically operated.

**TAF and TER:** Trains operated with diesel engines, air conditioned and usually running during the daytime between all the major cities.

**RAPIDO:** Good standard trains operating during daytime.

**EXPRESS:** Good night train with sleepers.

**AUTOMOTORES and FERROBUSES:** These are a kind of autorails especially recommended for short journeys or excursions from major cities.

**OMNIBUS-TRANVIAS-LIGEROS:** Trains that stop at most stations along the itinerary.

All long distance trains have snack bars and diners. Meal prices range from 75-90 pesetas for a continental breakfast to 325-400 pesetas for lunch or dinner, extras like wine or liquor not included.

Most trains have sleepers in Spain. The service is operated by Compagnie Internationale des Wagons/Lits. There are compartments with 1-3 beds, also kitchenette compartments with bunk accommodations for six persons. Sleeper supplements vary according to the length of the trip and type of train.

**BAGGAGE:** Free allowance of 60 lbs. (80 kilograms) registered baggage per person. Children travelling half fare, 30 lbs. (40 kilograms) on domestic tickets. Passengers are allowed to take hand luggage with them provided it conforms to normal size (2.5 meters) and does not occupy excessive space.

**PETS:** Allowed in kennels on payment of special ticket.

**REDCAPS (MOZOS):** Usual charge for ordinary load (2 suitcases) is 50 pesetas.

**RESERVATIONS:** Should always be made in advance. While in Spain all reservations may be made at any Spanish travel agency or at the "Oficinas de Viajes de RENFE"-any person boarding a train without first purchasing a ticket is charged double fare. In Madrid-OFICINA DE VIAJES DE LA RENFE, Alcalá, 44. Tickets for Spanish railways may also be bought at the office of the French National Railroads, but only when the trip goes beyond the Spanish borders, Madrid-Paris, Madrid-Lisbon, for example.

**EURAILPASS:** Spain is among the European countries offering a joint railroad ticket called "EURAILPASS" This ticket is valid on all trains for periods of 15 days, 3 weeks, 1,2,3, months; the costs are \$170, \$210, \$260, \$350 and \$420, respectively. Student Eurailpass valid for 2 months of 2nd class, \$230. Children under 12 half fare and under 4 free. The holder may travel as many miles as he wishes during the period of validity. The French National Railroads is now in a position to assist prospective passengers in making reservations and issuing tickets at normal rates for train travel in Spain.

**CHILDREN:** Under three years free but not entitled to a seat; from 3-7 (4-10 with international tickets) half fare and may occupy a seat; over 7 (10 with international tickets) full fare. On trains subject to special supplements, the latter are paid at normal rates.

**KILOMETRIC TICKET:** The Spanish National Railways offers kilometer tickets in 1st and 2nd class. These tickets afford a reduction on fares at normal rates, but a minimum of 5,000 kilometers must be purchased, valid for three persons. These tickets afford

a reduction on fares at normal rates, but a minimum of 5,000 kilometers must be purchased, valid for three persons. This kilometric ticket, (Billete Kilometrico) which is a booklet containing coupons worth 10 kms. each, can only be purchased in Spain, either from a travel agency or from the offices of the Spanish National Railways.

Persons using kilometric tickets may have to pay a small supplement when traveling in certain trains such as the Talgo and a few others.

**SPECIAL RATES:** Besides the savings entailed by the Kilometric Tickets, there are now tickets with as much as a fifty per cent discount on certain days, termed "Dias Azules" of which there are 305 in 1977. Therefore, if you are not travelling on the dates listed below, you may qualify for one of the special rates. In essence, the facilities now granted are as follows:

- For travellers 65 years of age and over: 50% discount
- Parties of ten passengers or more: 25% rebate
- Those attending fairs, conventions, and the like: 25% discount
- For the "Auto-Espreso" service, (a family with a car travelling on the train: up to 70% discount

Arrangements for the special rates quoted above must be made through an office of the Spanish National Railways (RENFE). The RENFE offices will provide the necessary documents for travel to both Spaniards and foreigners that qualify.

By virtue of an agreement between the French National Railroads (S.N.C.F.), the German Railroads (D.B.) and the Spanish National Railways, cards issued to senior citizens in one country are valid also for the other countries. For example, holders of RENFE senior citizen cards issued to travellers 65 years or older, besides the 50% reduction on journeys within Spain (on "Dias Azules") will also accrue a 30% rebate on rail travel in France and Germany on the basis of a round trip ticket bought in Spain.

The dates when these reductions are NOT applicable are:

January 2, 6, 9; March 18, 20; April 1, 2, 6, 7, 10, 11; May 18, 22; June 8, 12, 23, 24, 28, 30; July 1, 2, 8, 9, 15, 16, 18, 22, 23, 25, 29, 30, 31; August 1, 2, 5, 6, 12, 13, 15, 20, 28, 30, 31; September 1, 4, 11; October 8, 12, 29; November 1; December 7, 8, 11, 16, 17, 23, 24, 25, 30, 31

The offices of the French National Railroads is able to assist prospective in making reservations and issuing tickets at normal rates for train travel in Spain. Their address is given in the "Eurail Pass" section in this circular.

**OTHER INFORMATION:**

Sleep er supplements have to be added to standard fares. The maximum to a first class ticket and the minimum to a second class ticket.

Round trip fares are approximately double one-way fares.

Persons planning to travel extensively by trains in Spain are advised to purchase the "Guia Renfe-Horario de Trenes". Available in Spain at most railroad stations and in many bookstores. Price is 100 pesetas. Explanations in Spanish, French English and German.

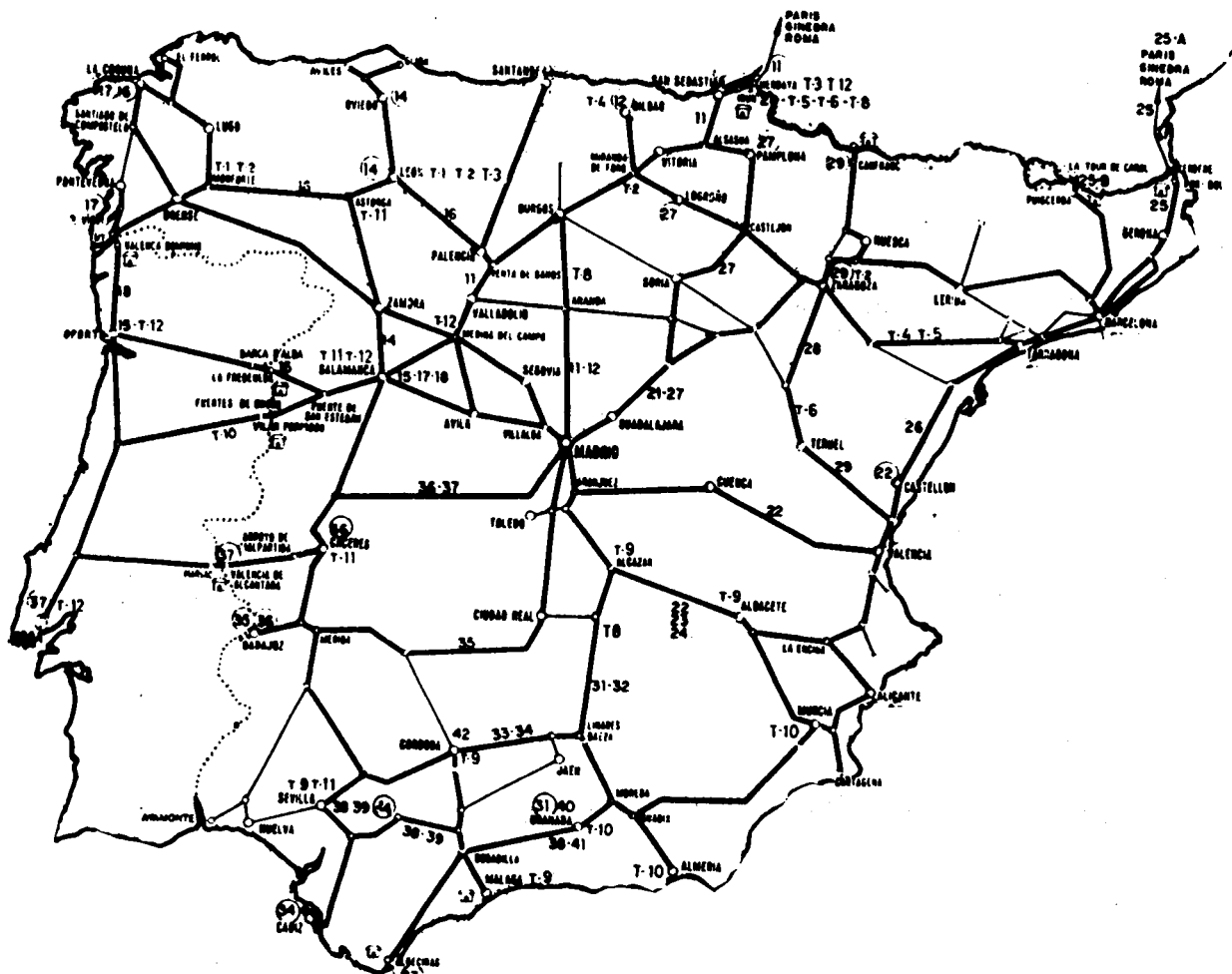

GENERAL INFORMATION ON SPAIN

## WHEN AND WHERE TO GO

## PASSPORT-MONEY-CUSTOMS

**SPRING:** This is probably the best season to visit the whole of Spain, though the northern coast will be still rainy and cool. Spain is at her most beautiful and recommended are the regions of Castile, Andalucia and the Mediterranean coast, as well as the Balearic Islands. Most of the main touristic events take place during the Spring. The climate is generally fair, though it can be rainy in Spring, especially in the month of April.

**SUMMER:** An ideal time to visit the north as the central and southern regions are hot. The Mediterranean coast and Balearic Islands are popular because though warm they enjoy pleasant sea breezes.

**AUTUMN:** An excellent season to visit the whole country, although a little late for the northern coast. The climate is generally excellent with long sunny days and blue skies. Possible rains in November.

**WINTER:** The Costa del Sol and Balearic Islands are favored at this time. The climate is usually mild with long hours of sunlight. The high mountain regions, especially the Pyrenees, Sierra de Guadarrama and Sierra Nevada offer excellent conditions for winter sports.

**THE CANARY ISLANDS:** They offer a warm and even climate throughout the year. The temperature rarely rises above 85F nor falls below 57. The high season is during the Winter months, when there are the most tourists. But the twelve months of the year offer equal attractions for a visit to the Canary Islands.

**PASSPORT AND VISA REGULATIONS:** No visa is required for U.S. passports. To remain longer than six months in Spain a resident's permit is required, obtained from Direccion General de Seguridad, in Madrid, or from Gobierno Civil in each provincial capital. Non U.S. citizens should consult with the nearest Spanish Consulate to find out if they require a visa. Consulates in the U.S.A. are in Boston (Mass.), Chicago (Ill.), Houston (Tex.), Los Angeles (Cal.), Miami (Fl.), New Orleans (La.), New York (NY), San Francisco (Ca.) and Washington D.C.

**INNOCULATIONS:** None required to enter or leave Spain.

**MONEY:** The Spanish national currency is the PESETA which is divided in 100 centimos. Tourists may bring into Spain any amount of money but only up to 50,000 pesetas per person in Spanish currency. Upon leaving Spain they can take all foreign money not exchanged but only up to 3,000 pesetas in Spanish currency. The present rate of exchange is 85 pesetas=\$1.00 but this may fluctuate from one week to another.

**CUSTOMS:** Persons arriving at the Spanish border are asked to submit luggage for examination by Customs officials. Personal effects, portable typewriters and cameras, movie cameras of 8 and 16 mm. are admitted free of duty if they show unmistakable signs of use. Tobacco may be imported duty free in reasonable quantities. When leaving Spain tourists may take purchases up to the value of 25,000

pesetas. Over and above this sum an export license is required. It can be obtained from the Commerce Department in Spain.

Sportsmen may bring with them their shotguns and a reasonable supply of ammunitions (50 cartridges for each rifle and 100 cartridges for each shotgun.) Cartridges for most calibers may be purchased in Spain.

Hunters must be in possession of a valid hunting license legalized by a Spanish consulate.

PETS: No quarantine in Spain. A certificate stating that the animal is in good health and has been successfully inoculated against rabies (for dogs) is required. This document must be issued by a veterinarian and certified at the nearest Spanish consulate. Only a certificate of good health is needed for cats. Pet foods are available. Dogs are admitted in Spanish hotels at the discretion of the management and boarding facilities as well as veterinarians are available.

#### TRANSPORTATION TO SPAIN FROM THE USA

AIR: The Spanish airline IBERIA, TWA and PAN AMERICAN airlines operate several flights daily from different US cities to Spain. Flying time is about 6.5 hours eastbound, westbound about 7 hours. One may also fly to Spain via other western European countries using their national carriers. Fares vary GREATLY and we do suggest one consult a travel agent or airline. IBERIA has offices in:

#### TRANSPORTATION IN SPAIN

AIR: Iberia Airlines, the national carrier, operates a wide network of air services between all major cities in Spain, as well as to the Balearic and Canary Islands. Aviaco, another Spanish carrier, serves some cities not included in Iberia's network. More information may be obtained from travel agencies and Iberia offices.

RAIL: Spain, like most European countries, has an excellent railroad network with fast and comfortable trains. R.E.N.F.E. is an abbreviation for Red Nacional de los Ferrocarriles or Spanish National Railroads. The following trains are recommended:

TALGO: ultra-modern train operating between Madrid-Irun, Madrid-Zaragoza-Barcelona, Madrid-Valencia-Barcelona, Madrid-Malaga and Madrid-Sevilla-Cadiz.

ELECTROTREN: Very luxurious with modern sound system for music and information.

TAF and TER: Modern trains, diesel engines, operate during the day between major cities.

EXPRESS: Night trains with sleepers.

RAPIDO: Good standard trains that run during the day.

AUTOMOTORES: Autorails recommended for short journeys.

All long distance trains in Spain have restaurants and snack bars.

RAIL (CONTD.)

Tariffs for Spanish trains are very reasonable. Persons traveling a minimum of 3,000 kilometres (about 1,860 miles) may purchase a kilometric ticket which affords savings of about  $\frac{1}{4}$  the usual fares. (Billete Kilometrico) The Eurail Pass and student rail passes are also honored in Spain. Information on these passes may be obtained from travel agencies as some of these passes (such as the Eurail Pass) must be purchased in the United States.

**BUS:** Public bus service in Spain is very well developed and most lines have modern equipment. Although these lines at times cover long distances they are especially recommended for short trips and also for excursions from the major tourist centers.

**SHIP:** Those planning to visit the Balearic or Canary Islands may travel from the mainland using Compania Transmediterranea. This national carrier has good connections from Barcelona, Valencia and Alicante to the Balearic Islands, and from Barcelona and Cadiz to the Canary Islands.

**AUTOMOBILES:** Tourists may drive with their own autos or rentals. Most of the major car rental firms have offices in Spain. American drivers licenses are honored in Spain but should have a translation in Spanish legalized by the nearest Spanish consulate. Most rental firms require an International Driver's Permit, which can be obtained from the AAA. Visitors may bring any kind of motorised vehicle into Spain, providing they do not engage in transporting merchandise or persons over Spanish territory for pay. When bringing foreign vehicles into Spain, the driver must produce either an International Motorised Vehicle Insurance Certificate (green card), or proof that the driver has insurance covering civil responsibility beyond the frontier. Gasoline is about 40 pesetas per liter and 37 pesetas for regular. Gas-oil is about 17 pesetas per liter.

**MOTORCYCLES-RENTAL:** Spanish and European motorcycles may be rented in Spain for about \$6.00 a day. There are weekly and monthly rates. These are usually advertised in newspapers or tourist magazines.

**BICYCLES:** Spain is a mountainous country which makes cycling difficult except in such areas as the Castilian plateau in the center of the country. Bicycles may be taken in the trains as registered baggage.

**TOURS:** Many American tour operators have excellent tours of Spain. It is best to consult a travel agency about these. Especially recommended are those offered by the Spanish tour companies ATESA and MELIA. Both have offices in the USA and their tours may be bought through most travel agencies. **TAXIS:** All taxis are equipped with taxi meters in which fares are registered. There are a few supplements authorized in certain cities like trips to the airport or train station. Taxis authorized supplements must always be placed in view of the passengers. In some cities there are cars for public service known as "gran turismos" which do not have taxi meters and one must rely upon the drivers' judgement for the calculation of the fare to be paid. Both taxis and gran turismos must carry a "Libre" sign-a green light at night-meaning free when empty. Taxis are easily recognized by the taxi-meter inside and the word TAXI painted on the outside.

ACCOMMODATIONS

**RESERVATIONS:** We cannot stress too much the need for reservations in hotels, especially during the summer

months at the height of the tourist season, and especially for the Paradores as they tend to be rather small and in demand. Travel agencies can make all kinds of reservations, or each establishment may be contacted in writing. An International Reply Form, which is obtainable at the Post Office, will expedite confirmations.

**HOSTALS AND PENSIONES:** These lodgings are also rated by stars. (They go up to 3 stars). Good for long stays and for those who prefer a more familiar atmosphere. Roughly equivalent to a boarding-house. Prices range from \$3.80-\$6.50 for a single room to \$6.50-\$11.50 for a double. Meals range from \$1.75-\$6.25.

**GOVERNMENT OPERATED LODGINGS:** The State Tourism Department offers the following:

**PARADORES:** Usually converted castles and palaces or modern structures planned and built with maximum hotel conditions and decorated in keeping with the atmosphere and tradition of each area.

**ALBERGUES:** Offer sleeping facilities and restaurant service at strategic points along the roads. Situated far away from large towns and good for driving.

**REFUGIOS:** Mountain lodges recommended for hunters and sportsmen.

**HOSTERIAS:** Typical restaurants, offer regional dishes.

These lodgings are classified also by the star system. Most of them tend to be rather small and are not meant for extended stays.

**APARTMENTS AND VILLAS:** Especially plentiful in coastal regions. We advise whenever possible to stay at a hotel or pension and look around in person for a suitable place, especially for extended visits. Prices can vary greatly according to season and location.

**CAMPING:** Many campgrounds, especially along coastal areas. These can range from rustic to wildly luxurious.

## RESTAURANTS

Classified by 1-5 Forks. There are also cafeterias classified by 1-2 Cups. All restaurants must offer a standard meal at a fixed price (Menu del Dia) This menu consists of hors d'oeuvre, two main courses, dessert, bread and wine. Also serve a la carte.

## OTHER INFORMATION

**COMPLAINTS:** All hotels and restaurants have at the disposal of clients a book where complaints of any kind are registered. These books are regularly inspected by inspectors of the Tourism Department.

**TAXES:** Taxes and service charges are always included in hotel and restaurant bills. Nevertheless, it is customary to tip an extra 5-10 % if the service has been good.

**TIPPING:** Please be reasonable. Overtipping does not help anyone. 10-50 pesetas according to the occasion should suffice.

**PORTERS:** Always found at airports and railroad stations. Charge is 10-15 pesetas per piece of luggage.

**LANGUAGE:** The official language is Spanish or Castilian. Catalan is spoken in the Barcelona area with its derivatives-Valenciano in and around Valencia, and Mallorquin in the Balearic Islands. Basque is spoken in the Basque provinces and Gallego (related to Portuguese) is spoken in Galicia. Foreign languages are spoken in hotels of the higher categories, some restaurants, travel agencies, and most exclusive shops and large department stores.

**ELECTRIC CURRENT:** Both 110 and 220 (50 cycles) are used in Spain, although 220 is becoming more generalized.

**BULLFIGHTS:** The season starts in March and runs until the middle of October. Bullfights always take place in the afternoon and in Madrid and Barcelona there is usually on Sundays and holidays, at least one. In the other Spanish cities they are held during local festivals.

**TOURIST INSURANCE:** When travelling in Spain one can purchase an insurance policy that covers Medical assistance, accidents and baggage theft. Cost is as follows:  
8 days-\$4.00 15 days-\$5.00 30 days-\$7.00  
These policies may be purchased at all local National Tourist Offices in Spain.

**PURCHASES:** If goods are to be shipped home, the following should be noted:

1. Receipts should be obtained from the store indicating the merchandise bought and the exact amount paid. These receipts should also indicate how much has been paid for packing, shipping, and insurance.
2. Shipping cost usually includes only expenses as far as a port or airport in the USA. There are additional charges to be paid here for customs, port handling and forwarding to the final destination.
3. If the purchases have been insured, the store should give the buyer the name and address of the insurance company and their US representatives. If the goods arrive broken or damaged the insurance company must send an inspector to evaluate the damage. The inspector's fee is paid by the owner of the merchandise and it often happens that this fee is higher than the value of the item which might have cost only a few hundred pesetas.

**BOOKS AND MAPS:** The Spanish National Tourist Office supplies maps, pamphlets and information circulars free of charge. There are also many books written on Spain that are available in retail book stores.

CLOTHING: Shorts and bathing suits are not acceptable attire for city streets though most of the resorts are as casual as any other elsewhere. The larger cities tend to be somewhat "dressier" than the smaller ones. Pantsuits for ladies are perfectly acceptable in most places provided they are in good taste and not sloppy-especially in restaurants. It might be a good idea to carry a head covering of some sort is one is going to be visiting many cathedrals, though not all require women to have their heads covered. In general, what ever the local residents are wearing is an indication of what is acceptable. Most hotels have "Modistas" (dressmakers) available to make minor repairs.

TELEPHONE SERVICE: Spain has good telephone connections with the US and Telephone Credit Cards are accepted. Some hotels may add a surcharge on international phone calls.

WEIGHTS AND MEASURES: The metric system is the standard in Spain.

To convert from kilometers to miles, divide the number of kilometers by 8 and multiply the result by 5.

To compute Fahrenheit: Multiply Centigrade by 1.8 and add 32.

To compute Centigrade: Subtract 32 from Fahrenheit and divide by 1.8.
